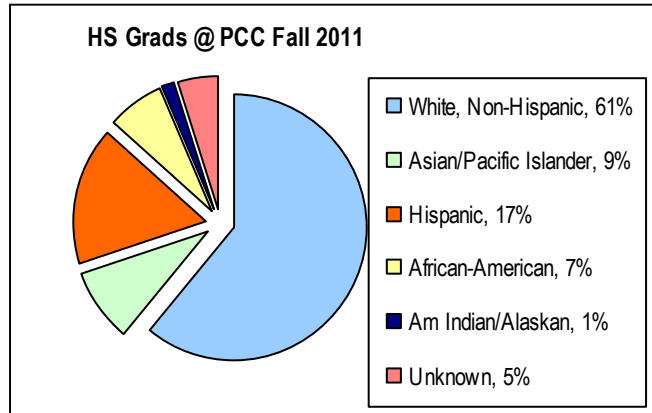


Recent High School Graduates¹ Attending PCC: Fall 2011 Cohort

Approximately 2,687 recent high school graduates from over 210 different high schools attended PCC in Fall 2011; most (85%) indicated they were “degree-seeking.” Tables A,D

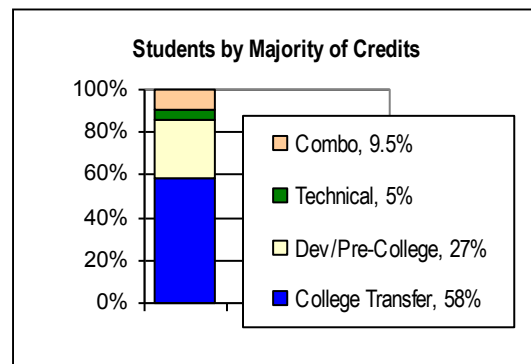
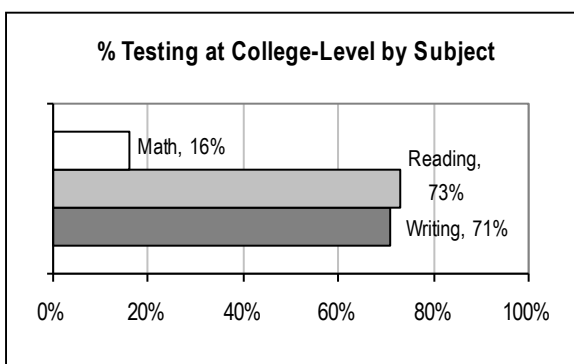
Student Demographics



- The student population distribution was similar to the region’s public high school race/ethnicity populations. Table B
- Thirty-one percent of students received financial aid. Table E
- Most graduates were from Oregon schools with the highest numbers from Westview, Century, Tigard and Glencoe High Schools.

Academic Preparation and Course Taking Behavior

- Over one-half (52%) of students enrolled full-time (12 or more credits) and 36% enrolled in 6-11 credits. Table C
- Students were likely to take most of their courses at Sylvania (39%), followed by Rock Creek (35%), Cascade (17%) and Extended Learning Campus (9%). Table I
- Students generally tested as having college-level reading or writing skills and below college-level math skills.² Tables F, G, H
- The majority (58%) of students enrolled primarily in college transfer courses and 27% enrolled mostly in developmental/pre-college instruction. Table J



Academic Performance

- Approximately 78% of the students finished the fall term with a grade point average (GPA) of 2.0 or higher. Table K
