Dual Admission and Enrollment Program

What is it?

An opportunity for students to complete one application process for enrollment at Portland Community College and/or Oregon State University. The program is open to all transfer programs.

What is my application status?

Students seeking an associates and/or bachelor's, or additional undergraduate level coursework:

Undergraduates: U.S. citizens and residents pursuing their first bachelor's degree. Many students in the program also earn an associate's degree.

International students: Students from abroad pursuing their first U.S. bachelor's who are also interested in completing an associate's degree.

***Post-baccalaureates:** Students who have earned a bachelor's degree interested in completing a second bachelor's while possibly earning an associate's degree. Contact OSU Office of Admission and Orientation for application materials.

What are the benefits?

- One application process for both PCC and OSU
- PCC/OSU advising available at either campus
- Increased flexibility in scheduling with access to more classes
- Opportunity to access services and participate in college life on both campuses:
 - Student Employment Services, including work-study*
 - Student internship programs*
 - Dixon Recreation Center*
 - Student Health Services (with coverage under the Oregon Health Plan)*
 - Admission at OSU Student prices to PAC-10 athletic events*
 - Involvement in student activities (music, theater, art, and intramural sports)*
- Financial aid available for qualified students admitted under the dual admission/enrollment program
- Access to library and computer lab resources on both campuses
- Skill-building through preparatory courses at PCC and lower division courses at either PCC or OSU
- Easier transition from community college to university

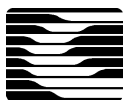
