Adult High School Diploma

Portland Community College offers an adult high school diploma for students 16 years or older.

The college does not offer high school courses.

Students in this program attend regular college classes. Students receive a high school diploma from PCC after successfully completing current state requirements (refer to the credit chart). Credits earned at the high school will be evaluated and applied to the PCC High School Diploma. The PCC credits earned toward the diploma can also apply toward a college certificate or degree. This program must be planned with the high school completion office located on the PCC campus the student wishes to attend.

PCC Courses for High School Credit

Students may arrange to take college courses while still attending high school with the written approval of the student's high school. College classes can count toward both high school and college credit. Students will meet their high school's requirements and the diploma will be issued from the high school the student is currently attending.

Procedures for Admission to the Adult High School Diploma Program

Applicants must:

- Be at least 16 years old.
- Students 16 or 17 years of age must be officially released from compulsory education.
- Recommended that the student have a minimum of 10 credits from an accredited high school or equivalent college course work.
- Arrange for their high school to send an official transcript, mailed or hand-delivered in a sealed envelope, to the PCC High School Completion Specialist at the campus they plan to attend.
- Submit an admissions application and fee to PCC
- Complete the English, reading and math placement tests, regardless of the number of high school credits earned. Complete the New Student Orientation online or at the campus they plan to attend in person.
- Meet with a High School Completion Specialist to discuss transcript evaluation and placement test results and review remaining graduation requirements.
- Complete financial arrangements. Students will be billed for tuition and fees. Students are responsible for purchasing books and supplies by the first day of class.

Requirements for Graduation from the Program

In order to receive the Adult High School Diploma, students must:

- Meet the State of Oregon requirements for the PCC Adult High School Diploma.
- Meet the English, reading and mathematics competency requirements prior to receiving their diploma.
- Meet the college residency requirement by completing a minimum of six college credits with a minimum PCC grade point average of 2.0.
- Pay a \$10 fee that will remain valid for one year and submit a high school graduation petition to the campus High School Completion Specialist.
