**Agreement Between Concordia University
and Portland Community College (PCC)**

Concordia University (CU) agrees to accept in transfer from Portland Community College (PCC) up to 95 quarter (64 semester) credits from students who have successfully completed the Associate of Applied Science degree in Alcohol and Drug Counseling and to accept these students after the University admission process is complete, into the Bachelor of Arts in Psychology program.

The following conditions apply in order for transfer to occur:

- a. 77 or more quarter credits of Alcohol and Drug Counselor courses.
- b. 18 or more quarter credits applicable to the general education requirements currently in effect at CU. (See attachment A for courses at PCC which qualify to meet the general education requirements at CU.)
- c. All course grades are at a "C" level or better in order to transfer.
- d. In order to be admitted to the Psychology program, students must have attained a cumulative GPA of 2.50.

CU and PCC agree to communicate all changes in their respective Alcohol and Drug Counseling and Psychology degree programs and, if necessary, to modify this agreement accordingly. Department Chairs will be in frequent contact to maintain a close relationship between the programs.
