**TRANSFER ADMISSION DEADLINES:** Rolling (Open) Admissions. No Deadlines.

**ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS:** Students must have high school diploma or GED, be at least 21 years of age, be currently employed OR have access to an organizational environment, which will allow completion of program coursework.. To enter the undergraduate nursing program, you must have earned an Associate Degree in Nursing from a regionally or nationally accredited institution or diploma in nursing from an CCNE accredited hospital school of nursing, have a valid, unrestricted, unencumbered RN license from the United States, one year of full time work experience in the health care industry, current employment as an RN and be a citizen or permanent resident of the United States or hold an approved, valid visa if attending a campus located in the United States.. If you are not employed, you must have access to a health care organizational environment that allows you to apply the concepts you learn in our courses.

**ACCEPTANCE OF CREDIT FROM A TWO-YEAR INSTITUTION:** The University of Phoenix accepts many credits from Portland Community College. Specifics vary from program to program. Please refer to the General Education sheet.

**INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS:** The University of Phoenix encourages the participation of qualified international students in their programs. All classes are taught in English and require proficiency in English. The TOEFL examination is required of applicants whose native language is not English. The TOEFL is given in both computer and paper-based formats; applicants must have a minimum **TOEFL** score of **213 computer-based** or/ **550 paper-based**. Academic records from countries other than the United States must be evaluated by the evaluation service approved by UN of Phoenix. The evaluation services follow standards approved by the National Council on the Evaluation of Foreign Credentials. If the academic records are in another language, a certified English translation is required. The University will accept translations from the issuing institution or an official translation service.
