Business Administration majors are expected to also complete coursework in an area of advanced study (Accounting, Entrepreneurship, Environmental Management, Finance, International Business, Marketing, or Sports Management) or select a minor in the Liberal Arts.

The religion/theology studies requirements can be deferred to one's junior year.

The Associate of Arts Oregon Transfer degree is the preferred degree for students pursuing Concordia's B.A. Business Administration major. This is a traditional program open to all business students.

.PCC DEGREE/TRANSFER INFORMATION:

Associate of Arts/Oregon Transfer (AAOT) Degree – (Preferred degree for this major). When transferred to Concordia, the AAOT satisfies the lower-division general education requirements except for the 10 semester credits of Religion required.

Associate of Science (AS) Degree – The courses listed above may be included in the AS degree. The degree does NOT guarantee that students will be accepted as having completed all lower division comprehensive and General Education requirements for a baccalaureate degree. Student should work with an Academic Advisor to plan for transfer to the school and major of their choice.

Transfer without a PCC Degree – Students may elect to earn credits and transfer to a four-year institution without earning a PCC degree. Please meet with an Academic Advisor for an individualized plan of study.

PCC endeavors to create accurate transfer guides for students; however, requirements may change without notice. Students are responsible for working with PCC advisors and their transfer institution to ensure that their academic plan will meet requirements and timelines.

Major Concentrations

Accounting: An undergraduate business administration degree with an emphasis in accounting can lead to a career that is both personally and financially rewarding. Concordia's accounting graduates have pursued careers in consulting, accounting, attestation engagements, taxation, financial planning, and litigation support.

Concordia's accounting concentration covers fundamentals for private industry, government agencies, non-profit organizations, and public accounting firms. The in-depth internship program connects you to Portland area CPAs and other accounting professionals for practical on-the-job experience.

Through the program, you will also have the opportunity to meet recruiters from Portland CPA firms and other organizations at Concordia's "Meet the Firms" night.

Environmental Management: Our Environmental Management Program enables you to choose, depending on your interests - the direction from which you want to approach your environmental studies. The basic concept of the Program is that you will earn an anchoring bachelor's degree in Biology, Chemistry, Business Administration or Marketing. As you work toward your degree, you will build into your studies environmental specific courses. In business your environmental studies will comprise 17 semester hours plus a three credit hour Environmental Science Course that will serve as part of the general education requirements for graduation. These courses include such topics as environmental and natural resource economics, law, regulations, and risk analysis.

The concentration in Environment Management for Business majors is designed to prepare you for entry-level responsibilities in the business/marketing world with a working knowledge of environmental/natural resources issues to give you a wider breadth of understanding. It is designed to give you an added edge - to be able to understand and to help foster the sustainable development ethos that is the future of business.

Finance: We can connect you to one of the finest finance programs in the country. What is finance? Basically, it is the art and science of managing money. You'll learn what it takes to make important decisions on how to invest a company's resources, how to create a complete financial picture of a company using quantitative tools, what it means to be a financial manager and how to take that knowledge into the workplace. Whether or not you ultimately go into finance professionally, the knowledge gained through this curriculum will aid you in practical ways throughout your professional and personal life, making you a more valuable employee and a more savvy manager of your own finances. When you participate in our finance program, you will be exposed to the following:

Financial Systems: Learn about financial systems, how those systems operate in macro and micro environments.

Corporate Finance: Many of our customers elect to become financial managers of a corporation. This class is designed to look at different strategies needed to successfully manage the finances of a business operation.

Investments: Take control of you personal finances! We can show you how to plan ahead and develop sound investment strategies. The annual Concordia University Investment Challenge (sponsored by Solomon Smith Barney) allows you to put investment skills to the test.

International Business: Our International Business program will teach you how to become a global business leader. It is a challenging prospect, but one that can net huge returns.
