Graduates of **PCC's two-year Alcohol and Drug Counseling** degree may transfer course work to Concordia University for the Addiction Studies option. Students who have taken courses in this discipline at PCC (or who plan to), should contact Concordia's transfer advisor for more information.

In addition to the departmental requirements listed above, students planning to transfer to Concordia also must complete coursework for university admission and lower division general education requirements (if not completing an AAOT). Requirements for Bachelor's of Arts degrees and Bachelor's of Science degrees are built right into the curriculum for each major. The religion/theology studies requirements can be deferred to one's junior year.

PCC DEGREE//TRANSFER INFORMATION:

Associate of Arts/Oregon Transfer (AAOT) Degree – (Preferred degree for this major). When transferred to Concordia, the AAOT satisfies the lower-division general education requirements except for the 10 semester credits of Religion required.

Associate of Science (AS) Degree – The courses listed above may be included in the AS degree. The degree does NOT guarantee that students will be accepted as having completed all lower division comprehensive and General Education requirements for a baccalaureate degree. Student should work with an Academic Advisor to plan for transfer to the school and major of their choice.

Associate of Applied Science (AAS) Alcohol and Drug Counseling – This PCC two-year degree is accepted in transfer by Concordia University for entry into their B.A. Psychology, contact Concordia University for details.

Transfer without a PCC Degree – Students may elect to earn credits and transfer to a four-year institution without earning a PCC degree. Please meet with an Academic Advisor for an individualized plan of study.

The Psychology major offers students an opportunity to explore the forces that shape human behavior and thought. In addition to completing the psychology core requirements, students must choose either of three concentrations: addiction studies, child and family development, or graduate school preparation. This degree program provides outstanding preparation for work in the mental health profession, particularly in drug and alcohol dependency intervention; advocating for children, youth and families; or matriculating into graduate school programs designed to produce counselors, psychologists, or psychiatrists. Admission to the Psychology major requires a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.50, demonstration of competency in the principles of psychology, and attainment of junior status.
