ADMISSION DEADLINES: Corban does not have specific admission deadlines. However, there is limited enrollment and it is best to apply early.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS: Corban College welcomes Christian students who value a comprehensive Christian education and meet college admissions criteria. The College seeks students who are able to present strong academic records and a clear testimony of faith in Jesus Christ. The Admissions Committee also evaluates each applicant's ability to succeed in college and are in agreement with the Statement of Faith and lifestyle policy of the college.

A transfer is considered a student who has taken or will have taken at least 31 semester hours or 47 quarter hours at a previous post-secondary institution. A student must also submit the following items:

- A pastoral reference from a senior pastor, youth pastor, or Bible professor
- A personal reference from an adult
- Official transcripts from all post-secondary schools attended. If less than 31 semester units or 47 quarter units then we will need high school transcripts and SAT/ACT scores.
- A non-refundable \$35 application fee

A 2.0 GPA is required to transfer from another college or university. A student should be in good standing at the last college or university they attended.

Corban College accepts the Associate of Arts Oregon Transfer degree with the following conditions:

1. All course work must be 100 level or higher.
2. The AAOT does not meet Biblical requirements.
3. It may not always meet the Thought and Culture sequences which are required for Corban's bachelor degree. The Thought and Culture courses must be satisfied with 16 semester hours in U.S. History, Western Civilization, Literature and Fine Arts.
4. It must include 62 semester hours (93 quarter hours) with a grade of C- or higher in all transferrable courses to enter with junior class standing.
