Liberal Arts Core Curriculum (LACC) Requirements
(For transfer students who have not completed the AAOT/ASOT degree)

WRITING

WR 121 or **WR 121H** & **WR 122** or **WR 122H** English Composition

WR 122 is required for students who take WR 121 fall 2008 and beyond.

COMMUNICATION STUDIES (3 credit hours minimum)

SP 111 or **SP 111H** is preferred. Other SP courses will be accepted. SP 105-Listening *will not* be accepted. You may waive Speech 111 by successfully preparing and delivering a formal speech. Contact the Humanities Division (503) 838-8408.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION (4 credit hours minimum)

HPE 295 + 1 **PE** course is preferred. Also accepted is **HE 250** + 2 **PE** courses or 4 **PE** courses; the courses should be from Rhythms, Aquatics, Team, Individual, and Fitness. Not all PE courses can be in the same area.

CREATIVE ARTS (9 credit hours minimum)

Select courses from **Art, Dance, Music, and Theatre**. A combination of these areas is preferred. A maximum of 3 hours in music performance is allowed.

LITERATURE/MODERN LANGUAGE (7 credit hours minimum)

2-3 course **English** sequence. Up to 4 credits of English Literature may be met through a foreign language, including sign language.

PHILOSOPHY/RELIGION (3 credit hours minimum)

1 course in **Philosophy** or **Religion**

LABORATORY SCIENCE (12 credit hours minimum)

Select 3 laboratory courses from **Biology, Geology, Physics, Chemistry, or General Science 106, 107, or 108**. You are required to take at least 8 credits in the same discipline.

SOCIAL SCIENCE (11 credit hours minimum)

8 or 9 credits in the same Social Science discipline is required. Preferred, but not required, is a sequence in the same discipline. This must include **Anthropology, Economics, Geography, History, Political Science, or Sociology**. The remaining credits may be in any Social Science course including **Psychology** or **Criminal Justice**.

B.A.& B.S. Requirements on back of sheet

Complete either Bachelor of Arts or Bachelor of Science requirement

(Some majors do not give you an option, check with your major advisor or the college catalog):

BACHELOR OF ARTS (B.A.)

Writing Intensive Courses (6 credits minimum) –To be taken at Western Oregon

Second Language- Proficiency in a second language demonstrated by course work through the 203 level or by examination through the 203 level. Second Language will satisfy the Cultural Diversity requirement.

Mathematics (4 credits minimum) – Complete **MTH** 105 or higher at PCC

Computer Science (2-3 credits minimum) – **CIS** 120, 121, 122, 135D, 140M, 246, **BA** 131, **CAS** 133, **CS** 140U, 161, 162, 260

BACHELOR OF SCIENCE (B.S.)

Writing Intensive Courses (6 credits minimum) –To be taken at Western Oregon

Cultural Diversity (6 credits minimum) – Most of the Cultural Diversity courses are 300 or 400 level courses that you can take at Western Oregon. There are a few courses at the 100 and 200 level that you may take at PCC. You can choose from **ART** 101, **ASL** 101, 102, 103, 201, 202, 203, **ATH** 101, 102, 103, **CJA** 111, **D** 170, **FR** 101, 102, 103, 150, 151, 201, 202, 203, **GEO** 106, **GER** 101, 102, 103, 150, 151, 201, 202, 203, **HST** 101, 103, 201, 202, 203, **MUS** 108, **PS** 205, **SOC** 206, **SPA** 101, 102, 103, 150, 151, 201, 202, 203, **TA** 101

Mathematics/Computer Science (12 credits minimum) – At least 1 course in Math and one course in Computer Science is required. Choose from the following:

Math: **MTH** 111, 112, 116, 211, 212, 213, 231, 232, 241, 243, 244, 251, 252, 253, 254, 256, 259, 261 (MTH 105 does not meet the math requirement)

Computer Science: **CIS** 121, 122, 135D, 140M, 246, **BA** 131, **CAS** 133, **CS** 140U, 161, 162, 260

Students must have a minimum of 55 credits of Liberal Arts Core Curriculum

Students may use one course to satisfy multiple requirements. For example: Spanish 101 would meet LACC literature, BA foreign language requirement, and diversity requirement.

There is no double dipping between major & minor, even when the same course is specifically listed in both places, in this case a course substitution must be done and a different class must be selected with advisor and department approval.
