Students may apply for admission at either campus. All nursing courses are taken at the Portland campus.

College Place, WA **GPA requirement: 2.75**

Portland, OR **GPA requirement: 3.25.** Applicants with higher GPAs (without having to repeat courses) are given priority. Typically, the admitted student has: A's and B's in Anatomy & Physiology/Chemistry/Microbiology, a GPA of 3.4 or above, admission test scores above the minimum, and never had a C- or below in a prerequisite course.

Walla Walla University is a Seventh-day Adventist college which welcomes any student wishing to obtain a quality education in a Christian environment. The college offers nursing courses at two sites. The **main campus** is located in **College Place, Washington** and the **nursing clinical campus** is in **Portland, Oregon**.

The freshmen and sophomore years of the nursing curriculum can be taken on the **College Place, Washington** campus; they include a combination of general studies and nursing courses. Transfer students can access either campus at the sophomore level. The junior and senior years are taken on the **Portland, Oregon** campus and include nursing and some general studies courses. The School of Nursing Portland campus offers a unique summer entry option for transfer students who have completed the required prerequisites. Once admitted, these students can take sophomore nursing courses during the summer term on the Portland campus and then proceed as juniors and seniors. An **RN Plus option** is also available on the Portland campus for licensed RNs who have an associate degree or a diploma in nursing.

Admission - Portland Campus of Walla Walla University

All prospective students must apply to both Walla Walla University and the School of Nursing (two different application forms). All admission files (including Portland applicants) are compiled and kept on the main campus in College Place, Washington.

Admission Testing

In order to take nursing admission tests; **you must have a current application on file before testing**. Please refer to the website above for application information. In Portland, testing is scheduled from December through January with the Student Program Advisor at 503-251-6115 ext. 7304. Tests must be paid for at the time of testing; exact change is best.

1. Accuplacer on-line Reading Test (not timed), \$10 cash.
2. Accuplacer on-line Arithmetic Test (not timed) \$10 cash.
3. Health Sciences Reasoning Test (timed: 50 min.) \$10 cash.
