All coursework for the major, including prerequisites, must be completed with a grade of "C" or better. Students must achieve a cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 2.75 in all courses that will transfer to the major to be considered for admission. A 2.75 GPA does not guarantee admission. It is the minimum to be considered for admission. Generally, Anatomy/Physiology, Microbiology and Computer Applications must have been completed within the last seven years (counting back from the application deadline).

Applications are accepted beginning mid-November until the application deadline, February 1st (there is a \$50 application fee). There are three start dates each year: summer, for students who hold a bachelor's degree at the time of application, fall for students with and without a prior bachelor's degree, and spring exclusively for students working on their first bachelor's degree. (Start terms and cohorts subject to change.) Approximately two hundred students are admitted each academic year based on educational background, progress toward completion of prerequisite courses, and available space.

PCC DEGREE/TRANSFER INFORMATION:

Associate of Arts/Oregon Transfer (AAOT) Degree – The courses listed above may be included in the AAOT degree. Students who complete this degree and are accepted at Linfield College, will, at a maximum, have to take two Linfield Curriculum courses from the Vital Past, Images & Arts, or Ultimate Questions. This means choosing two areas, and taking one course in each area. .

Associate of Science (AS) Degree – The courses listed above may be included in the AS degree. The degree does NOT guarantee that students will be accepted as having completed all lower division comprehensive and General Education requirements for a baccalaureate degree. Student should work with an Academic Advisor to plan for transfer to the school and major of their choice.

Transfer without a PCC Degree – Students may elect to earn credits and transfer to a four-year institution without earning a PCC degree. Please meet with an Academic Advisor for an individualized plan of study.

PCC endeavors to create accurate transfer guides for students; however, requirements may change without notice. Students are responsible for working with PCC advisors and their transfer institution to ensure that their academic plan will meet requirements and timelines.

The Linfield-Good Samaritan School of Nursing offers the Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN). The School of Nursing offers admission to transfer students who can demonstrate that all prerequisite course requirements will be completed by the program start term. **Admission options include a junior entry for those students seeking a first bachelor's degree and an accelerated option for students that have earned a prior bachelor's degree.**

In preparing to apply for admission, applicants should construct a prerequisite course plan that takes into consideration current commitments to work, family and other activities. It is important to keep in mind that each prerequisite course is transferred to the major and is fundamental in building a strong knowledge base for the nursing profession. Grades in prerequisite courses and all courses transferring into the nursing major are used to establish a BSN GPA, which is used in the evaluation process for admission.

In most cases, an applicant that has earned a prior bachelor's degree by the application deadline will be considered for the accelerated BSN program, provided that all prerequisite course requirements will be completed by the program start date. Students with a prior degree will also be considered for fall entry. Students seeking their first bachelor's degree will be assigned to a fall or spring start term.

Those students who already possess a bachelor degree in a field other than nursing do not need to complete the College Writing, or Linfield's general education courses. These students will also be considered for the Accelerated BSN program.
