2009-2010 Transfer Guide Portland Community College

All undergraduate students at Marylhurst University are required to complete the Liberal Arts Core (LAC). Below are recommended transfer courses that complete the core. Only courses graded C- or above will be accepted for transfer. Depending on the program, a maximum of 120 lower division credits can be transferred to Marylhurst. **Prospective students are encouraged to meet with a Marylhurst adviser early in their academics to ensure they are taking the appropriate transfer courses needed to meet the requirements for an undergraduate degree.**

The Liberal Arts Core is built around a set of learning outcomes. For the purpose of this transfer guide one outcome is represented by one course, but an outcome can also be met through options like assessment testing and prior learning.

Students will take LAC 301 within their first two terms of enrollment to map out their future Marylhurst coursework.

Completion of the Associate of Arts Oregon Transfer Degree (AAOT) meets most Liberal Arts Core requirements, with a few exceptions. MTH 105 will be accepted if part of the AAOT. See the chart below for the outcomes met automatically with the AAOT. Students who do *not* complete the Associate of Arts Oregon Transfer Degree can complete nearly all of the Liberal Arts Core requirements below at PCC. The list shows many PCC courses a student might use to meet our requirements, but it is by no means a complete list. Transfer Information

1. Only courses graded C- or above are accepted in transfer for use toward a Marylhurst degree.
2. Many courses designated as vocational / technical or occupational are accepted at Marylhurst. Questions regarding transferability of these courses should be addressed to an Admission Advisor at (503) 699-6268.
3. Developmental and Cooperative Education courses are not transferable.
4. A Marylhurst degree requires 180 quarter credits. Forty-five of these credits must be taken at Marylhurst. (Web-based courses meet this requirement.)
5. Students who would like to apply for dual enrollment with Portland Community College and Marylhurst University must submit a co-admission application; official transcripts from all colleges / universities attended; proof of high school completion or GED; a recommendation from a professional or academic reference; and proof of measles immunization. Students interested in meeting with an Admissions Adviser may contact the Admissions office at (503) 699-6268.
International students may also contact the Admissions office to speak with the International Student Advisor.
6. Up to 45 Prior Learning Assessment credits, plus 45 credits from CLEP/DANTES testing, may be earned for learning that has occurred in the workplace, or through volunteerism, traveling, and other non-traditional educational experiences.
