

When you complete the double degree program, you will receive two Bachelor degrees; one in the major of your choice and the other in Elementary Education.

In addition to completing the requirements for the major of your choice, you will also need to complete the following Lower Division Department Requirements for the Elementary Education major. A 3.0 cumulative GPA is required for all course work used to fulfill content mastery requirements.

What is the Education Double Degree?

With the undergraduate Education Double Degree program, you take only 40 additional credit hours in education along with the coursework for a degree in your chosen field.

The Education Double Degree has been designed for students to take concurrently while completing their primary degree. Students may enter the program at any time between their freshman and senior years.

Students who are interested in teaching the lower grades (K-3) often major in Human Development & Family Sciences with an option in Early Childhood Development & Education. If you are interested in this major, it is recommended that you complete WR 121 & 227 along with SP 214. It is also recommended that you complete both HPE 295 and FN 225.

Students who are interested in teaching the upper grades (4-8) often major in Liberal Studies.

What testing is required for the Education Double Degree?

- Students are required to take the CBEST (California Basic Educational Skills Test) and pass it prior to being admitted to the provisional level of the program. Prior to student teaching you must complete and pass the appropriate NES content test. <http://www.thenestest.com/tests.asp>

What are the advantages of the Education Double Degree?

- You will graduate with two degrees – one in your chosen field and one in education.
- You are licensed to teach upon graduation.
- You will be part of one of the best Schools of Education in the Northwest. Oregon State University is nationally accredited through NCATE and has been preparing teachers since 1909.

Teaching is an immensely rewarding career. You will have the opportunity to make a difference in the life of a child every day.

With an Education Double Degree, you will be authorized to teach at one of the following levels: Early Childhood/Elementary (age 3-grade 4); Elementary (grades 3-8); Middle Level (grades 5-10; or High School (grades 7-12).

The Education Double Degree for K-12 is 40 quarter hours: 8 credits of core requirements; 17 credits of teaching methods; and 15 credits of student teaching.

PCC DEGREE/TRANSFER INFORMATION:

Associate of Arts/Oregon Transfer (AAOT) Degree – The courses listed above may be included in the AAOT degree. Students who complete this degree and are accepted at Oregon public universities will be admitted as having completed all lower division comprehensive and General Education requirements for a baccalaureate degree.

Associate of Science (AS) Degree – The courses listed above may be included in the AS degree. The degree does NOT guarantee that students will be accepted as having completed all lower division comprehensive and General Education requirements for a baccalaureate degree. Student should work with an Academic Advisor to plan for transfer to the school and major of their choice.

Transfer without a PCC Degree – Students may elect to earn credits and transfer to a four-year institution without earning a PCC degree. Please meet with an Academic Advisor for an individualized plan of study.
