

Lower Division Department Requirements for the Educational Foundations Major:

The Educational Foundations is an undergraduate degree and **does not culminate in licensure**. Educational Foundations students can apply to a variety of licensure programs in teaching including elementary teaching, special education, and early intervention at the University of Oregon or at another institution of higher education. U of O no longer offers the Integrated Teaching Program.

To enter the undergraduate major in Education Foundations, students will complete 72 credits of general education and elective classes prior to submitting their application. Students will have an overall GPA of 2.5 in all college coursework completed and a GPA of 2.75 in education classes completed as of the application deadline, **February 1, 2010**.

In addition to the departmental requirements listed above, students must also complete coursework for university admission, general education requirements, and BA/BS requirements. Meet with a PCC Academic Advisor to develop an effective transfer plan that will meet your individual needs.

PCC endeavors to create accurate transfer guides for students; however, requirements may change without notice. Students are responsible for working with PCC advisors and their transfer institution to ensure that their academic plan will meet requirements and timelines.

The Educational Foundations major prepares students with a solid understanding of public education, the foundations of teaching and learning that inform public school teaching, and knowledge about educational practices in a variety of other professional arenas.

The Educational Foundations major can accommodate full or part-time students in a flexible plan of study. Depending on completed upper-division course work, students in this major choose a two-year or a three-year plan of study.

Application, Deadlines, and Admission

Fall 2010 deadline for application is February 1, 2010.

As a student at the University of Oregon, you must submit a formal application to the College of Education to be considered for admission to the Educational Foundations major.

If you are not currently a University of Oregon student, you must also apply for admissions to the University of Oregon. Separate applications are needed for admission to the University and to apply to the College of Education. Each application requires official transcripts so be sure to order enough. Check the admissions link for upcoming admission deadlines.

The completed application must include:

- 1) Complete application form
- 2) A personal goals statement
- 3) Name/contact information for three references
- 4) Official undergraduate transcripts from all institutions attended, including from the University of Oregon

All files will be reviewed by College of Education faculty or staff members as part of the admission process. Incomplete or late applications will not be reviewed.

PCC DEGREE/TRANSFER INFORMATION:

Associate of Arts/Oregon Transfer (AAOT) Degree – The courses listed above may be included in the AAOT degree. Students who complete this degree and are accepted at Oregon public universities will be admitted as having completed all lower division comprehensive and General Education requirements for a baccalaureate degree.

Associate of Science (AS) Degree – The courses listed above may be included in the AS degree. The degree does NOT guarantee that students will be accepted as having completed all lower division comprehensive and General Education requirements for a baccalaureate degree. Student should work with an Academic Advisor to plan for transfer to the school and major of their choice.

Transfer without a PCC Degree – Students may elect to earn credits and transfer to a four-year institution without earning a PCC degree. Please meet with an Academic Advisor for an individualized plan of study.
