TRANSFER ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS:

- Completed application with \$45 application fee
- Completed and signed payment plan worksheet
- Official transcripts from all higher education institutions attended (we request most transcripts for you)
- A minimum GPA of 2.0 on prior college course work
- TOEFL may be required for applicants whose native language is not English
- As well as the following, based on the type of degree being sought:

Associate's Degree: No previous college experience necessary; 1 year of full-time work experience (no minimum age requirement); completion of high school diploma or GED; and official high school transcripts (required only if student has completed less than 2 courses at college level or has completed fewer than 2 years of work experience).

Bachelor's Degree: A minimum of 48 college-level credits from an accredited college or university or CLEP, PEP, and ACE, or other standardized evaluations (no specific course prerequisites prior to admission); a minimum GPA of 2.0 on prior college-level completed coursework; and 2 years of full-time work experience (no minimum age requirement).

Master's Degree: A baccalaureate degree from a regionally accredited college and two letters of recommendation.

ADMISSION DEADLINES:

Warner Pacific College's Adult Degree Program is a non-term program, making it possible to apply and enroll in programs throughout the year, including the summer months. Credits are awarded as semester credits.

PRIOR LEARNING EXPERIENCE:

Credit will be awarded for college-level learning that has occurred outside the classroom. This can be verified in 3 ways: 1) successful completion of proficiency examinations, 2) submission of professional certification obtained through non-college instruction, and 3) writing papers documenting learning that has occurred outside the college classroom.

ACCEPTANCE OF CREDIT FROM A TWO-YEAR INSTITUTION:

Warner Pacific accepts the AAOt as meeting their general education courses except for Religion and upper division Humanities courses.

PCC DEGREE/TRANSFER INFORMATION:

Associate of Science (AS) Degree – The courses listed above may be included in the AS degree. The degree does NOT guarantee that students will be accepted as having completed all lower division comprehensive and General Education requirements for a baccalaureate degree. Student should work with an Academic Advisor to plan for transfer to the school and major of their choice.

Transfer without a PCC Degree – Students may elect to earn credits and transfer to a four-year institution without earning a PCC degree. Please meet with an Academic Advisor for an individualized plan of study.
