Applications are welcome after this date, but late applications risk not being processed in time for enrollment and may delay enrollment to a later semester.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS:

Personal Statement, Pastor Reference, Teacher/Employer Reference, Friend References (two needed), Application Fee (\$40 U.S. funds), Official Transcripts (to be sent directly from your high school or college, including reports of AP, CLEP, and International Baccalaureate credits), official SAT Reasoning Test or ACT test scores-scores are required of all entering freshmen with less than one year of college-level transferable credit (minimum of twenty-four semester hours). Be sure to use the school's code #4496 (for SAT) or #3476 (for ACT) when you request scores to be sent to Multnomah University.

Physical Education – 1 semester hours	Students must take 2 quarter credits in any Physical Education (PE) course
