Work with your advisor to determine which of the following courses will meet General Education requirements for the Oregon Transfer Module, associate's degree you are pursuing (AAOT, AAS, AGS, AS, or ASOT in Business) or the transfer program you are working toward.

The following is a comprehensive list of courses. Not all courses listed below will be offered every term. Please check the schedule for course availability.

When selecting courses for your first term at PCC, pay close attention to your reading, writing and math placement scores. Many of PCC's courses require students to be ready for WR 121 (defined as scoring 79 or higher on the COMPASS writing test and 88 or higher on the COMPASS reading test; or completing WR 115 and RD 115; and readiness for MTH 60 or completion of MTH 20. The chart below suggests appropriate courses for the different placement levels.

Please Note: There are many Career/Technical Education programs which offer introductory courses to the General Public and that do not have any pre-requisites. Please consult with your advisor as to appropriateness of these courses toward your degree and for Financial Aid applicability.
