

As of Summer 2011, the following changes will be implemented:

MTH 60 (61+62)	4	Intro Algebra – 1 <sup>st</sup> term	0.5
MTH 65 (62+63)	4	Intro Algebra – 2 <sup>nd</sup> term	0.5
MTH 70	4	Review of Intro Algebra	1

At the Adult High School Diploma meeting, it was decided that all new and returning (been out more than one academic year) students must meet the new requirements with the units as listed above. This would be in effect regardless of whether or not a returning student has completed the class.

Some clarifications were requested at the meeting.

- AHSD students can take MTH 60-65 (0.5 units each) or MTH 61-62-63 (1/3 unit each) or MTH 70 (1.0 unit) to complete algebra 1, but may not earn more than 1.0 unit towards the AHSD even if they take two or three pathways.
- Students cannot take MTH 70 after one of the other pathways (60-65 or 61-62-63) and earn 0.5 units as an elective. MTH 70 is an equivalent to 60-65 or 61-62-63 and therefore is not eligible to be used as an elective.
- If a student takes Algebra I in the high school and then takes Math 65 at PCC, only one of them would count in the Math section of the degree requirements but the MTH 65 could be used as an elective. The most favorable amount of credits will be applied. So, if the HS math is going to give a student more "units" than the PCC math, then they would receive the HS "units" and vice versa for PCC credits.

We realize that math continues to be a challenge for many students. We encourage you to participate in brainstorming ideas for helping students achieve their math goals as the steering committee responds to increased math requirements.
