Dear Student,

The PCC Illumination Project is seeking students to participate in our social change theater program during the upcoming academic year.

The *Illumination Project* is an exciting student leadership and interactive theater program based at the PCC Sylvania campus. The program is designed to address issues of oppression including racism, sexism, heterosexism, and classism through classroom and community presentations utilizing interactive theater. Students enter the program in the middle of fall term and continue through the end of spring term.

The *Illumination Project* has a dual purpose. First the project provides participating students with an opportunity to learn about social justice issues and interactive theater and develop skills as educators, actors, activists, and leaders. These students then educate other students, staff and faculty audiences on confronting stereotypes, conflict negotiation and promoting racial, gender and economic equity.

The *Illumination Project* helps the campus community to build understanding and explore issues. Interactive theater challenges the viewpoint of both the audience and performers and allows the audience to enter the scene and dynamically change its outcome.

The *Illumination Project* training is highly interactive and we will base our work on the life experiences of students involved. Students in the program gain skills in writing, acting, facilitating, events coordination, activism, education, public relations and community organizing.

Jeannie LaFrance coordinates the Illumination Project. Jeannie has 20 years experience doing social change theater and anti-oppression education and organizing.



Program Commitment

To Be Eligible you need to commit to a THREE TERM process that includes:

Fall term: We start in the middle of fall term. Class time is on Mondays and Wednesdays from 1:00 pm to 2:50 pm and meets in PAC 101. There will also be a mandatory retreat weekend. You can find out the dates for the beginning of class and the retreat from our website or by going to the IP office CC272.

Winter and Spring Terms: Six to eight hours a week that includes class time, homework, committee work and theater performances around the PCC Sylvania, other PCC campuses and community organizations. Class continues to meet on Mondays and Wednesdays 1-2:50.

During the upcoming academic year you will need:

- ◆ To be a PCC student in good standing
- ◆ To have a 2.5 GPA or above
- ◆ To meet standard prerequisites (WR/RD 115 and Math 60). These may be waived with instructor approval.
- ◆ To be enrolled at PCC with at least 4 credits per term besides the Illumination Project
- ◆ To have a flexible enough schedule to meet outside of class time

We are also looking for the ability to:

- ◆ Follow through on commitments. This includes **time commitments.**
- ◆ Work collaboratively in a diverse group
- ◆ You **DO NOT** need any previous theater or oppressions training



Students in the Program Receive:

- ◆ Four free sociology credits each term (214 a,b,and c). These credits are college transferable, meet general education and diversity requirements. Students receive a total of **12 tuition free credits.**



How to apply:

- ◆ Limited space is available in the program so we encourage you to start the application process immediately.
- ◆ Respond in writing to the supplementary questions on a separate sheet of paper making sure to include your name, phone number, student ID #, email and street address, and **furnish two references** using the attached forms or by having your reference write a letter addressing the questions in the form. **You must also attach an unofficial print out of your transcript from PCC.** You can get your transcript from your mypcc home page.
- ◆ Applications are available on the Illumination Project website www.pcc.edu/resources/illumination/ or in the Women's Resource Center CC 273, The Multicultural Center CC 202 and in The Illumination Project office CC 272.
- ◆ Application due date is posted on the website.
- ◆ Turn-in the form and two letters of reference and your transcript to Room CC 273, The Women's Resource Center or CC 272, The Illumination Project office
- ◆ After turning in the application form and accompanying materials you will be contacted for an in-person interview.
