## Dear District Residents,

IN 2008 VOTERS APPROVED what at the time was the largest bond measure ever passed in the state of Oregon. As we move forward to complete the capital improvements you sanctioned, I want to take this opportunity to sincerely thank you for your support. Current students—and all those to come-will benefit in profound ways from the vision you helped set forth. All of us here at PCC take very seriously the public trust you have placed in us.

Over the last seven years, PCC has sought to realize the vision set forth by the college and community. Today, 70 percent of the bond revenues raised for this work has been invested in a wide range of improvements across four PCC campuses and four centers. This past fiscal year alone, we have opened two new energy-efficient buildings, upgraded seismic safety, completed state-of-the-art lab facilities, and created two new retail opportunities for local entrepreneurs.

Work still remains, including creating a presence for PCC in Columbia County, where the college is currently assessing possible sites and programs. But much of what PCC set out to achieve through the Bond Program has been accomplished—thanks to you.

Students, faculty and staff across the college are enjoying larger, more modern facilities with state-of-the-art equipment and resources. The new opportunities that have been created for students are helping them build a brighter future for themselves and their families. The regional economy has also benefited as PCC has entered into contracts with more than 2000 companies. Most of them are local, and more than 25 percent of them are state-certified minority-owned, women-owned and emerging small businesses. This fulfills a major goal of the college to spread the economic benefits of the bond work throughout our community.

## Southeast Campus

### THIS FISCAL YEAR, PCC SOUTHEAST

continued its transformation from a center to a fully comprehensive campus where students can complete their degree. Two retailers thus far have leased spaces in the campus' new buildings, nearly fulfilling one of the Bond Program's goals of integrating commercial opportunities into new construction on campus. Old School Coffee now occupies the southeast corner of the Library, while Field Electric Bikes will soon open its retail space in the northeast corner of the Student Commons. Meanwhile, over in the Administration Annex, construction on a 1,000-square-foot kitchen was completed in time for summer term Community Education cooking classes. Remodeling work continues on the west wing of the annex and its new childcare center—a first for PCC Southeast. The east wing will soon house the expanded campus bike program and facilities management offices. These projects are expected to be completed fall 2015.

ter; Jobs and Internships; International Education; and Student and Graduate Employment Services. Seismic reinforcement as well as heating, ventilation and cooling upgrades will also be completed.

Phase III will begin winter 2016 and includes renovating the area that houses Technology Solutions Services, and replacing the flooring and updating the lighting to a portion of the upper mall.

Phase IV will begin summer 2016 and include new spaces for student resource centers, as well as a new student lounge near the River City Grill. Staff will have their own new lounge and technology space, both on CC's 100 Level.

## Rock Creek Campus

### AS PART OF THE BOND PROGRAM'S investment of more than \$63 million into

Rock Creek Campus, several projects have already been completed, including remodeling Building 1, a portion of Building 2 and building an addition for Building 7.

During summer 2015, seismic work was completed for Buildings 2 and 3, as well as the widening of the main entrance off Northwest Springville Road. In addition, construction began on an emergency-use egress road between Northwest 185th Avenue and the west side of campus.

Meanwhile, Building 5 continues to be the major focus of bond work at Rock Creek. Late in 2014, 22,000 square feet of the building's space was demolished, while leaving the gymnasium intact. When the new 62,000-square-foot addition opens in January 2016, Building 5 will be the heart of the campus, with new features to include a bookstore, expanded food services, study areas, a student government area, a multipurpose physical education/dance classroom, office space for faculty, and a lab for the Food Science and Nutrition program.

Still to come are more improvements to Building 9, where student services will be expanded and testing moved into the original bookstore space.

Sylvania is being done in several phases and contained within existing buildings, the improvements thus far have already had a significant impact for students, faculty and staff. PCC is investing \$64.6 million to renovate space in several areas.

Work completed in the past fiscal year included seismic upgrades at the bridges connecting the Science Technology (ST) and Social Science and Technology buildings, as ST Building.

In the College Center (CC), a dramatic two-story atrium was built at the east entrance to create a "front door" for the campus. The atrium also provides flex-

bond improvements, this vibrant urban campus has gained two new buildings, an underground parking facility, and a spacious landscaped plaza, all of which were celebrated at a community-wide event held in January, called "New Beginnings." And it has been a fresh start for the campus in every sense.

For this first phase of bond work, THA Architecture designed two three-story buildings, Cascade Hall and the Student Union. Cascade Hall is an academic building that houses classrooms as well as offices for key campus teaching programs, and a long sought-after childcare center. The Student Union is the hub of the campus and home to resource centers, student government, dining facilities, study/lounge areas and meet-

These new buildings have transformed the campus and-along with the newly renovated Paragon Club facing Killingsworth Street—have helped encourage the vitality of the adjacent historic commercial district.

The campus is now looking toward Phase II improvements, which include redesigning the Student Services Building to add an An-

THANKS TO NEARLY \$58 MILLION in swer Center and improved space for financial aid services, and remodeling the Library. The adjacent Student Center was demolished to build a large plaza that will open up the east end of the campus and create a center of activity for students and community events. A Free Plant Day was held for residents who wanted to "adopt" trees, shrubs and other landscaping that was displaced by the construction.







IN NOVEMBER 2008, voters approved a \$374 million PCC capital improvement bond measure. The college has received state, federal and Energy Trust grants, and interest earnings that have brought the program total to \$450 million. Through June 30, 2015, about 70 percent of the total budget has been spent.

The chart and graph represent the lifeto-date expenditures for the bond program. The total represents the spending across all campuses and centers and is summarized by type of expense. For example, 13 percent of total spending was for professional services. This includes all the architects, en-

gineers, surveyors, inspectors, movers, and other professional firms that were hired by the college through the bond program. The college has spent 5 percent to administer the bond program, including bond issuance costs. The lion's share of the spending-64 percent-has been spent on direct construction, completing new buildings and renovations throughout the district. PCC has spent 7 percent of the total purchasing equipment, such as computers and network equipment, to create greater access to learning. Finally, 11 percent of the total has been spent on land and building acquisition to accommodate needed expansion
