REVISION: AAS-BCO: Construction Management AAS Degree

- Added BCT 208, a new 1 credit course
- Total credits decreased to 94 credits due to the new General Education policy (see below for more)
- Most BCO students already work full-time in the industry

REVISION: ACERT1-MKTG: Marketing One-Year Certificate

- Made BA 111 and BA 211 "or" courses
- BA 111 is like BA 211 only slowed down substantially
- Revised outcome 5 by adding a period and changing "issues" to "standards"

NEW: ACERTP-EXYT: Yoga Teacher Certificate

- A Career Pathways Certificate, which can be either a stand-alone or stackable certificate
- Added 3 new courses: FT 120, FT 121, FT 280Y
- Conforms to industry standards set by Yoga Alliance, the major credentialing body recognized throughout the US and internationally
- There is a major demand in the industry for qualified yoga teachers and many students already are interested in such programs
- Much cheaper than programs taught in fitness studios and yoga centers

REVISION: PREREQ-FP01: Fire Protection Technology Prerequisites

- Updated and clarified prerequisite language
- Revised outcome 1 by putting "orientation" before "class"
- Revised outcome 2 by applying standard Curriculum Style Guide format: "MTH 20 ... or equivalent placement."
- These revisions were held up in the queue for 2 years due to significant turnover among faculty/faculty department chairs

REVISION: PREREQ-ITP01: ASL/English Interpreting Academic Prerequisites & Requirements

- Title change reflects more precise language designations currently in the field
- Revised academic requirement 1 to begin with "The AAS and the Two-Year certificate are full-time six term programs ..."
- Revised academic requirement 3 to begin with "Note: All ITP courses are open to professionals ..."
- Changed "educational" to "education" in 2nd to last sentence of academic requirement 5

Policies -

- AAS Gen Ed requirement: 16 credits -> 4 courses. The EAC approved this last June and this year the CTE SACs will update their degrees so that next year this will be in the catalog. This change reduces the degree credit totals because CourseLeaf calculates totals based on minimum number of credits needed and Gen Ed courses are 3 or more credits (although most are 4 credits). Anne Haberkern will be updating us on the implementation process for this year. Cases which just involve a reduction in total credits (i.e. total number of credits is 94 or greater so lowering credit total by 4 keeps degree above 90 credit minimum) will be handled as consent agenda items.
- In the meantime, this will reduce many program's total number of credits shown in CourseLeaf.
- General Education Outcomes: these were endorsed by the EAC last May and the
 goal is to get these approved by the EAC by December so that they are in place when
 GEARS begins reapproving Gen Ed courses in January. Kendra Cawley gave a
 presentation on how this impacts CTE programs and ongoing developments with
 the Cultural Literacy Outcome. See the Gen Ed Update on the DAC Committee's
 website.
