NEW: AAS-CCI: Creative Coding and Immersive Technologies AAS Degree

- New 90 credit degree introduces a positive relationship with code to student who
 have been historically underrepresented in these technologies very intentional
 equity focus.
- It includes a variety of programing languages that prepare students for good entry level positions in the coding industry upon graduation.
- A very unique program for Oregon and the country.

REVISION: AAS-MSA: Music and Sonic Arts AAS Degree

- Replaced demonstrating math competence by completing MTH 58/MTH 65 with completion of the new CTE course MUC 233 Math in the Arts.
- MUC 233 is non-substitutable.
- Revised coursework to better align with PSU's program.
- Total Credits 92->90.

REVISION: ACERTP-MSAC: Music & Sonic Arts Less Than One-Year Career Pathway Certificate

- Removed electives to align coursework with the 1st year of the degree.
- Total Credits 43->39.

REVISION: AAS-DST: Diesel Service Technology AAS Degree

- Course content in DS 105 & DS 205 was rearranged to create improved air conditioning and hydraulics learning sequence. DS 105 was changed from 6 to 3 credits and DS 205 was changed from 6 to 9 credits.
- Removed outcome 6.
- Postponed due the need for a unique outcome to differentiate the AAS-DST from the ACERT2-DST, which have exactly the same outcomes.

REVISION: ACERT2-DST: Diesel Service Technology Two-Year Certificate

- Course content in DS 105 & DS 205 was rearranged to create improved air conditioning and hydraulics learning sequence. DS 105 was changed from 6 to 3 credits and DS 205 was changed from 6 to 9 credits.
- No change in total credits.

REVISION: AAS-EMTP: Emergency Medical Technician-Paramedic AAS Degree

- National Accreditation standards have changed triggering course work revision.
- The Oregon EMS Education Consortium has modified their statewide Degree Outcomes triggering a revision of degree outcomes.
- EMT 105 and EMT 106 are now 6 credits each as a result of statewide changes
- Total Credits 104->102.

REVISION: ACERT-EMTA: Advanced EMT Less Than One-Year Certificate

- EMT 105 and EMT 106 are now 6 credits each as a result of statewide changes.
- Total Credits 20->22.

REVISION: ACERT1-EMS: Emergency Medical Services One-Year Certificate

- EMT 105 and EMT 106 are now 6 credits each as a result of statewide changes.
- Course revisions to match changes to AAS-EMTP.
- MTH 65 moved to the 1st term of coursework.
- Total Credits 59->54.

REVISION: ACERTP-EMSP: Emergency Medical Services Less Than One-Year Career Pathway Certificate

- EMT 105 and EMT 106 are now 6 credits each as a result of statewide changes.
- Removed EMS 113, credit change EMS 100 and EMS 114.
- Total Credits 24->22.

REVISION: AAS-HUS: Family and Human Services AAS Degree

- The recent change in the AAS Gen Ed requirement from 16 credits to 4 courses lowers the credit total for this degree from 91 to 89 credits. Adding one credit of PE to the degree brings the credit total backup to 90.
- No change in total credits.

REVISION: AAS-MSD: Management/Supervisory Development AAS Degree

- The recent change in the AAS Gen Ed requirement from 16 credits to 4 courses lowers the credit total for this degree from 92 to 89 credits. Increasing MSD Program/Workshop Electives from 9 to 11 credits and MSD Support electives from 11 to 12 credits brings the credit total backup to 92.
- Revised outcomes to include more assessable language.
- Revised outcome 3 by removing the comma after "perspectives" and placing it after "solutions"
- Revised outcome 4 to read "Demonstrate leadership skills to implement a planning process to delegate responsibility to employees, enhance their participation in developing, planning and evaluating their work-related projects, to accomplish organizational outcomes, enhance productivity, quality and cost control."
- No change in total credits.

REVISION: ACERT1-MSD: Management/Supervisory Development One-Year Certificate

- Revised outcomes to match revised outcomes of AAS-MSD.
- Revised outcome 3 by removing the comma after "perspectives" and placing it after "solutions"
- Mapped the Core Outcome "Community and Environmental Responsibility" to outcome 4, which matches the AAS-MSD.
- No change in total credits.

REVISION: ACERT1-SCM: Supply Chain Management and Logistics Engineering One-Year Certificate

- Revised outcomes to include more assessable language.
- No change in total credits.

REVISION: ACERT1-DA: Dental Assisting One-Year Certificate

- There is currently a huge demand for dental assistants
- The department decided to expand the program to include a part-time cohort model taught over the course of 5 terms which required creating two part equivalents of some courses (DA 110 = DA 110A + DA 110B; DA 111 = DA 111A + DA 111B) that would better accommodate the schedules of students attending PCC on a part-time schedule.
- No change in total credits.

REVISION: ACERTP-FP: Fire Protection Technology Less Than One-Year Career Pathway Certificate

- Revised the outcomes to reflect the National Fire Protection Association's standard language and current certification requirements.
- Removed courses which did not increase student's ability to get jobs.
- Total Credits 44->34.
