NEW: ACERT1-DFST: Deaf Cultural Studies One-Year Certificate

- This certificate is intended to replace the Deaf Studies One-Year Certificate.
- Learning outcomes have been substantially revised.
- Total credit hours reduced to 46 credits, which is more attainable for students.

NEW: ELECTV-DFST: Deaf Studies Electives

• A wide range of courses from various subjects are offered to appeal to students studying in different areas.

REVISION: AAS-MKTG: Marketing AAS degree

• BA 234 is now a required course, not an "OR" course.

REVISION: AAS-RAD: Radiography AAS degree

- Increased lab time to give students more hands-on practice positioning patients. This increased the credits for RAD 101/2/3 from 3.0 to 3.5.
- These course revisions were initially run as experimental 199 courses and the additional 0.5 credits of hands on instruction per course was found to improve student outcomes.
- Total credits hours increased from 102.5 to 104 credits.

STANDPOL-Appendix B: Educational Advisory Council By-Laws

- DAC chair approved the policy to move it along in the workflow due to the timesensitive nature of the policy.
- The new by-laws govern how remote EAC meetings shall be conducted during the extenuating circumstances of the COVID-19 pandemic.

Degree and Certificate Inactivations -

- CAWD degrees and certificates will be formally inactivated next academic year to allow time for the full teach-out to students to happen.

ELIWG recommendation regarding Institutional Learning Outcomes

• Delayed to next meeting.

Revising P/NP Policy during the COVID disruption? – Hannah Alzgal, student representative

- National discussion about how to grade and use of grades during the COVID disruption, some institutions are switching to pass/no pass grading instead of letter grading, how would this impact PCC students?
 - 1. The P/NP deadline could be extended to the end of the term at PCC.
 - 2. P/NP grades are disregarded when computing GPA. Student motivations may vary with GPA. Students with high GPAs may elect to take a class P/NP to preserve a high GPA. Students with low GPAs may feel compelled to choose a letter grade option so that they can improve their GPA.
- Current PCC policy A 106-Associate Degrees-Comprehensive Requirements: "A maximum of 24 credits of "P" (Pass) grades may be applied to a degree. Specific AAS degrees that deviate from this maximum will state the maximum in the degree requirements for the specific AAS degree."
 - 1. There could be a temporary lift to the 24 credit limit for students.
 - 2. There are some limits to this policy in CTE programs where state certification/licensure controls the number of credits, not PCC.
 - 3. Differences in limits set by PCC and state agencies should be carefully considered with an academic advisor or counselor.
 - 4. Students are *currently* allowed to appeal the 24 credit limit for unique situations.
 - Many students do not even know a petition process exists.
 - How does PCC make sure that all groups of students, especially historically underserved and 1st generation students, feel comfortable asking about the petition process?

Clear communication about the appeals/petition process and how to address unique credit/GPA situations should be sent out to students by the administration but also by faculty. Students are much more likely to take the message more seriously when it comes from a faculty member.
