## **Reports**

#### **EAC:** Stacie Williams

- EAC chair transition: Magda, who was the chair-elect for this academic year, accepted an interim managerial position before the start of fall. The EAC standing committee chairs have been filling in and sharing the duties of EAC chair. However, Doug Jones has volunteered to be the interim chair for fall term only. The EAC will then have an election for a new chair for the remaining academic year by the end of fall term.
- Committee members can pass their recommendations for a new chair to Stacie.

#### **APS:** Elizabeth McGlasson

- The committee is looking at the policy on registration holds and how some holds, for example, library fine holds, can create barriers for students. Can some of these holds be eliminated so they do not impede a student's academic journey?
- Syllabus policy: how are course modalities reflected in course syllabi? It is not clear from a policy perspective. This is under review.
- SAC Policy S701: SACs are an institutional creation of PCC. Should they continue to exist and function as they do? If so, then what should be their role? Or should PCC, now on a one-college model, retire SACs and distribute SAC responsibilities throughout their respective departments, like other colleges do?

#### TLCI: Anne Haberkern

• The college is still reviewing its new program development process. There is a current pause on new programs, including new degrees and certificates within currently existing SACs. Some exceptions may be made, but the pause will continue until the college determines what standards are appropriate for deciding which programs to keep and which ones not keep. Those standards would include an intentional focus on program viability / sustainability and what that means here at PCC.

## **Discussion**

### Pathway representation on the committee

- Gaps still remain in the committee's membership structure. Math representation is still needed on the committee, plus a few more representatives from the CTE-heavy pathways would also be helpful.
