Discussion:

Michael Reis - Accessible student language on CCOGs

The English SAC voiced some concern last year over how CCN course descriptions are written, as the language seems to be focused on students who have already selected a major. However, PCC students are sometimes more interest driven, meaning they are still exploring various options before selecting a major. We are able to make changes, up to 20%, if they are specifically linked to our style guide.

Non-grammar and non-syntax (plain language) changes we can consider:

- More inviting and inclusive language
- Limiting density of paragraphs
- Starting with an active verb
- Considering how our students come from many different backgrounds and levels of preparation that differ from university students

We don't need to reinvent things when our style guide already exists, and we will try to work on this during meetings versus having to do work outside of meetings. If time permits, we can try to review plain language examples by April's meeting.

April's Meeting

Our next meeting falls on the third day of spring term, which makes it difficult to review courses in a timely manner. We can consider changing next year's April meeting so that members have more time to review courses, but it might be difficult since we also need to consider DAC and EAC deadlines.
