

Eligibility Requirements


- 18 years or older (upon departure)
- Good academic and disciplinary standing
- Prerequisite course(s) completed or waived
- Attend an Education Abroad First Steps Meeting
- Independence, self-reliance, and maturity
- Willingness and ability to embrace the challenges of studying abroad.




In order to be eligible to participate on a PCC program, you need to be 18 years or older, in good academic standing, and have completed the course prerequisites. You will need to follow our process and timeline which shows that you are independent and mature and you are willing to embrace challenges (and fun) of traveling.




Let's take a closer look at the timeline you will follow as you prepare to study abroad. First, let's look at the Application Timeline.




Watching the First Steps Videos will be immensely helpful, providing short explanations about our processes and procedures. These videos are required viewing as a part of your application process, so good work completing the first video!



Early on in this process, you should apply for a passport. Passport applications take about 3 months to process, you need to complete your application by March 1st. We are happy to help and have resources on our website.



You should consider meeting with an Academic Advisor and a Financial Aid Advisor. Academic Advisors help make sure you are progressing academically to stay on track at PCC. The Financial Aid Advisor can look at your specific financial aid package to help you plan your finances. You will find a First Steps video specifically about funding your experience.



When you have completed these steps and are ready to apply for the program, you will submit an online study abroad application. To learn more about the application itself, take a look at the How to Apply webpage on our website posted below.






The deadline for the online application is February 15 for summer programs, and May 15 for the fall Sociology course in Cuba.




Let's discuss what happens after you turn in an application.




Once your online application is submitted, Education Abroad Advisors review your eligibility and will send you additional information via email about your next requirements. This multi-step process includes online and in-person requirements, including a Next Steps: Financial Planning meeting with study abroad advisors.



You will be asked to complete additional requirements in the study abroad application portal, such as understanding the process and timeline and our policies. These documents will help you prepare to study abroad.



At the same time, you can work on how you will fund your study abroad experience, such as putting together scholarship applications. Our office helps students with scholarship essays.



When you have completed the documentation and the meetings, you will be able to submit your non-refundable \$500 deposit, which holds your spot on the program.



Social Change in Cuba (Fall course)


\$500 non-refundable deposit




The program deposit deadline is February 22 for Summer programs, and May 22 for the fall sociology course in Cuba.




Let's give an overview of what you can expect once you have committed to the program by submitting your non-refundable deposit.




You will have required meetings, both virtual and in-person, to prepare you for your experience abroad. We will discuss travel arrangements, your housing, packing lists, and more.



There will be additional documentation to upload to the study abroad portal.



In May, you will register for the summer study abroad course.



In June, you will pay the summer tuition and remaining program fee. If you are applying for a fall program, refer to the dates listed on our website instead.



This is a multi-step process, and the Education Abroad Office is here to help.


