New Business

- 1. Fume hood inspections
 - a. SY one of the hoods in the biology space that didn't certify again FMS previously brought in a third party to look at it Evelyn will continue to work with FMS to fix it
 - b. CA has been a long running concern Need the hoods to be operation 80-120 face velocity but have been running very low (80-85) for years. Hoods at the end of the line have the most issues All of those hoods are connected to one system; one motor We have identified some bench top extractors in two rooms that are also connected. Evelyn had conversations with FMS about what would be needed to cut them off. It might also be to the point that those fans and motors are aging out. Follow up conversation needed between Linda, Dan, Evelyn and Larry Osborn May go on the PNCC project list.
 - RC hoods; two rooms will be remodeled and construction start Fall 2027 Julie Yeager Walker point of contact - Design development starting now - Losing labs spring and summer 2026
