The **PCC Illumination Project** is seeking students to participate in our peer education social justice theater program during Winter & Spring Terms 2021. As the COVID-19 situation evolves, so will the *Illumination Project*. The show must go on! The program will be run remotely or at Sylvania Campus if safe to do so.

The *Illumination Project* is an exciting student leadership program based at the PCC Sylvania campus. The program is designed to address issues of social justice including racism, sexism, heterosexism, and classism utilizing interactive theater. Students enter the program the beginning of Winter Term and continue through the end of Spring Term.

The *Illumination Project* provides participating students with an opportunity to learn about social justice issues and interactive theater while developing skills as educators, actors, activists, and leaders. These students then educate other students, staff and faculty audiences on confronting stereotypes, conflict negotiation and promoting racial, gender and economic equity.

The *Illumination Project* training is highly interactive and we will base our work on the life experiences of students involved. Students in the program gain skills in writing, acting, facilitating, event coordination, activism, education, public relations and community organizing. Students also build a close community of friends and colleagues.

Students in the program receive 8 tuition free Sociology credits.

Applications are due by 5:00 PM Monday, August 17th, 2020.

Program Commitment

To be eligible you need to commit to a TWO TERM process that includes:

WINTER TERM: Class time is on Mondays and Wednesdays from 11:00 AM -12:50 PM in PAC 101 or remotely. There is a mandatory retreat weekend on January 8, 9, and 10 (on-campus or via remote conferencing). The retreat schedule is as follows:

- ♦ Friday, January 8: 2:00 PM 6:00 PM
- ♦ Saturday, January 9: 9:00 AM 8:00 PM
- ♦ Sunday, January 10: 9:00 AM 2:00 PM

SPRING TERM: Ten to twelve hours a week that includes class time, homework, committee work, rehearsals and performances (in person or remote) around PCC Sylvania, other PCC campuses and community organizations. Class continues to meet on Mondays and Wednesdays from 11:00 AM - 12:50 PM with an additional class time on Fridays from 10:00 – 12:50 AM.



During the 2021 academic year you will need:

- ♦ To be a PCC student in good standing including with the Dean of Students
- ♦ To have a 2.5 GPA or above
- ◆ To meet standard prerequisites (WR/RD 115 and Math 20). These may be waived with instructor approval
- ♦ To be enrolled at PCC with at least 2 credits per term besides the Illumination Project. Spring Term IP Student Educators may not take more than 13 credits total
- ◆ To have a flexible enough schedule to meet outside of class time

We are also looking for the ability to:

- ♦ Follow through on commitments. This includes **time commitments**
- ♦ Work collaboratively in a diverse group
- You DO NOT need any previous theater or social justice training



Students in the Program Receive:

♦ Students receive a total of 8 tuition free credits - four free sociology credits each term (214 a and b). These credits are college transferable, and meet general education and cultural literacy requirements.

- ♦ Limited space is available in the program so we encourage you to start the application process immediately.
- ♦ Respond in writing to the supplementary questions on a separate sheet of paper making sure to include your name, phone number, student ID #, email and street address.
