Overview

Graduation Rates Overview

Welcome to the IPEDS Graduation Rates (GR) survey component. This information is collected to assist institutions in complying with the requirements of the Student Right-to-Know Act.

- Once a student is in the cohort, they remain in the cohort, even if their status changes to part-time or they drop out or transfer out of the institution. However, adjustments can be made to the cohort for allowable exclusions, which include the death of a student, permanent disability, military deployment, or service on an official church mission or with a foreign aid service of the Federal government.

Transfers/exclusions
