by a proud man we mean one who esteems himself better
then others; by a humble man we mean one who counts others
better than himself. The proud man is so convinced of his
intrinsic superiority that if appearances are against him,
if others obtain more recognition, honour, wealth than he,
the fault seems to him to lie in the evil constitution of
the world, which cannot recognise merit; for his own intrinsic superiority is the law which for him is always to be
taken for granted; ' his neighbours therefore find no favour
in his eyes, and he even desires their calamity and ruin,'
in order as the proud person puts it— that every man be set
in his due place. Meanwhile, the pruod man is always boasting of one one, dignities and gifts which do not yet
by appear. The proud person is like clouds

appear. The proud person is like cloud sky, and wind which frets the earth,

my wholesome rain. Exposition -- If on the moes are with him, wealth, dignity, honor superiority, and he moves on smoothly-to distruction - 'For-Pride goeth before haughty spirit before a fall,' but before ty." Pride brings a fall, lowly spirit Pride cloose the eyes to faults.

My purpose this morning is to examine the evil effects of pride, and extell the blessings that follow humility.

First of all, pride cuts a proud person off from all the benefical effects of reproof, rebuke, criticism and counsel, without which it is not possible for any of us to become wise. " A wise child, ' is the results of ' a father's correction," says the text, and such a child makes his father's heart glad; but the pridein a child's heart will often prevent him from receiving even the correction of a father, and will lead him to dispise his mother. And if the parents have not firmness and wisdom enough to overcome this childish resistance, it will grow with years, and prove more and more disastrous. The Bible instructs us, "He is in the way of life that heedeth correction, but he that forsaketh reproof is in error." If he had loved reproof he had would have acquired knowledge, but hating it he become brutish. He that refuses correction despiseth his own soul he that heareth reproof getteth understanding. As the child grows into manhood or womanhood, pride is still more likely to harden our hearts against counsel. Meanwhile, the lowly give heed to counsel and in doing so gather wisdom. No

matter who speaks the lowly listens. Exposition- Experiences teaches pride cuts a person off from help, humility makes the whole world its teacher. It enables us to learn from even a fool. Pride shuts off advice and becomes ensuared in its own ivory tower, humility gathers the wisdom of the lages. When you try to advise a proud man the begins to ask himself not what is the worth of the information but who is bringing the information of the information.

Then, by pride comes nothing but strife, and he loveth trangression that loveth strife; he that ratioth high his gate, builds a lofty house, seeketh destruction. It is the pride of monarchs and nations which produce war; the sense of personal dignity which is always sudden and quick in quarrel; the feeling of swollen self-importance which is afraid to make peace lest it suffer in the eyes of men. And in the affairs of private life our pride rather that our sense of right, usually creates, fosters, and embitters divisions. alienations, and quarrels. Pride says, I am perfectly innocent I bear no resentment but why should I make the first step, if you - says pride- will some to me, I am willing to forgive and forget." Humility says, "I think I am immocent, but then I may have given offence without knowing it; in any case, I may as well make an offer of apology; if I fail, I fail." Pride causes strife when those who prosper in the world will heartlessly turn their backs on relations who have not prospered. Men who earn their living one way will condemn those who earn their living in another way. Those who dress in The

who do not dress in fashion. From firsts to last a haughty spirit is a curse and a torment to every one, and of no value to the self. Exposition- Athaughty spirit is like a cold biting wind. It produces more sorrow than the north wind produces icicles. It breaks humble hearts, excites passions, it corrupts conduct of the weak, ruins children, poisons social life, flames indifference, plunges nations into war, divides churches. Well, I wish I could finish now but this leads us to contemplate the worst results of Pride and the loveliest outcome of humility. - The Bible informs us, "Every one that is proud of heart is an abomination to the Lord; though hand join in hand he shall not be unpunished." "The Lord will root up the house of the proud; but He will establish the border of the widow." In a word, Pride is hateful to God, who resists the proud and gives grace to the humble. The proud man, whether he knows it or not, comes into firect conflict with God; he may not sintend it, but he is patting himself against God. In that high look and proud heart there seems to be something dignified, flashing and luminous, and it is probably admired by men. By God it is not admired; it is regarded merely as the lamp of the wicked, and as sin. The proud dares the thunderbolts of God. He scorns men whom he sees, and in doing so he scorns God whom he has not seen; the men whom he consciously scorns will, take vengence upon

him. The proud man has hardenned his heart, he has grown

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Recture remedy. Exposition- On the other hand the humable man learns to know and to fear God. God reveals himself to the humble as he has to the proud- To the proud he is a God of vengeance to the humble he has healing in his wings, leading the contribution to the humble he has healing in his wings, leading the contribution to implicit trust in himself. No wonder few people know God, they think of themselves more highly than they ought to think- First Commandment- Thou shall have etc. We give honor to one another and to ourselves no realizing to believe in God implies the desire of no honor except that which comes from God. God never shares your heart.

If in ordinary human affairs " before destruction the heart of man is haughty, and before honor goeth humility." if even in our dealings with one another happiness and success and prosperity depend on the cultivation of a modest spirit, how much more when we come to deal with God must haughtiness appear the forrunner of destruction, and hunility the only way of approach to Him. It is not possible to think too humbly of yourself, it is not possible to be too lowly, you cannot abase yourself too much in His Holy Presence. IfuGod has set His leve upon you, and purposes to make you a temple for His indwelling, He will use method after method of humbling you to prepare you for his entrance. Again and again you will say, Surely now I am low enough, am I not humbled in the dust ? But His hand will still be upon you, and He will show you heads of pride which have yet to be levelled down. In the last humbling you will find that kahara there is rising within you a certain pride in the humility itself. That also will Hod subdue. That also will He subdue. And some day, if you are willing, you shall be lowly enough for the Most High to dwell in, humble enough to offer a perpetual sense of incense of praise
