Combined formats		Some examples:		In-person classes take place at specific times and locations.	Online classes don't have specific meeting times.	Remote classes take place at specific times online, usually in Zoom.
In some cases, it makes sense for a class to use more than one format. Look in the class schedule for classes that combine the convenience of online learning with the benefits of face-to-face interaction.		Remote and in-person: a class meets in Zoom for the first half of the term while learning theory and historical context. For the rest of term, the class meets in a lab setting to get hands-on practice.		Attendance in the classroom is required.	Regular online interaction is required and there are specific deadlines for assignments.	Students must be logged in during class meeting times.
		Online and in-person: each week, the instructor releases a pre-recorded lecture and supporting videos which prepare students for weekly studio sessions on campus.		All instruction takes place in-person. Some class materials might be delivered online.	All instruction is delivered online. Some instructors schedule optional meetings in Zoom.	All instruction takes place remotely during class meeting times.
		Remote and online: a class meets in Zoom each week to watch a live demonstration and lecture. Throughout the week, the instructor facilitates an online discussion board.
