What is the Grainger Tools for TomorrowSM scholarship program?

Who is Eligible to Apply?

Applicants must be United States citizens entering their second-year at a technical school, in which they are studying electronic systems, heating/air conditioning, plumbing, welding, automotive, construction or other industrial trade. Students must graduate from the same school at which they applied – the scholarship is not transferable to another institution.

What are the Criteria to Apply?

All applicants must provide the following:

- One letter of recommendation from a professor, teacher or advisor.
- A list of clubs, activities, leadership roles held and years involved.
- A summary or list of accomplishments and leadership roles relating to their field of study.
- An essay of 200-300 words on why the student chose to study technical education, how their achievements and/or leadership roles have helped them grow individually and their future goals within the technical field.
- GPA must be 3.0 or higher on a 4.0 scale.



What is Involved in the Selection Process?

Print and/or online applications are made available at each of the selected schools. All applications must be submitted by May 30.

A panel of qualified judges, consisting of school faculty, staff and board of director members, reviews the applications for educational merit, technical achievement, demonstrated leadership and commitment to the area of study. Grainger approves all final winners.

The selected winners will be notified by Grainger no later than June 30. All winners will be required to sign a photo release, submit to a background check and provide a biography and a photo headshot. Winners will be announced publicly later this year.
