Get a Real Estate License

- 1. Register for an account in eLicense, the Agency's online license management system.
- 2. Apply for a license and pay the \$300 nonrefundable application fee in eLicense. When the application is processed, you will receive an Applicant ID number by email.
- Complete 150 hours of required broker pre-license education from an Agencyapproved real estate school or 60 hours of required Property Management pre-license education
 - Give your Applicant ID number and full name to the school.
 - The real estate school will make you eligible to take the license exam.
 - Only courses completed on or after January 1, 2013, meet licensing requirements.
- Schedule and pay for the license exam online or at (833) 892-5441 with PSI, our testing services provider.
- 5. Pass both sections of the license exam.*
- 6. Pay and get fingerprinted for the required background check while at a PSI test center.*
- * Please note: License exam scores and background check clearances are each good for one year. The Agency can only issue a license while the relevant scores and background check clearance are valid.

A little about Neal:

Neal began his career as a high school teacher, both in Oregon and in Switzerland.

"My Switzerland experience started in 1988 and I was the computer guy for a school of about 150," he said. "Things were crude. We had a couple of systems and purchased a couple more by the end of the year"

Neal traveled a bit and worked at Bonneville Power Administration for a few years as a support technician and software trainer before starting his own company, Jump-start, in January 1996.

Recently, PCC and Jump-start partnered to help supervisors of a manufacturing company upgrade their Excel skills so they could update schedules and conduct forecasting for the plant. Another project was helping government employees update their Excel and Outlook skills. Many members of the Outlook class commented that the class would save them over ten minutes per day. A tenminute savings per day equates to a full week of productivity per year.





Meet Abdijelil

Abdijelil Ilmi moved to Portland, OR from the Somali region in Ethiopia less than a year ago. "At that time I had been working in construction for almost 8 years before immigrating to the United States," says Ilmi, and he wanted to find a way to apply his professional and educational qualifications in the United States. That's when he learned about the PCC Opportunity Centers and the programs they offer at a community event. He was particularly interested in Explore College and Careers because he heard the class helps immigrants and refugees navigate options, while also developing soft skills, building community, and practicing English. Abdijelil's management and interpersonal skills were apparent from the first day. He was positive and enthusiastic with his classmates, often leading the discussion and was able to foster connections that made the classroom feel like a network. Abdijelil brought a growth mindset to the class, and completed ExploreCollege and Careers in June of 2023 at PCC's Opportunity Center at 42nd Avenue.

After completing the Explore class Abdijelil was interested in more industry-specific information so his instructor, Allisa Cherry, recommended the Discover Manufacturing class as a way of finding out more about manufacturing careers, related programs at PCC, and other resources. Participating in this class did not come without challenges, as Ilmi explains "I was able to participate in Discover Manufacturing at PCC's Willow Creek Opportunity Center even though it was very far from home, and it required a lot of time management between the driving and the ESOL class I was taking at PCC at the same time." Ilmi was motivated to overcome these challenges because, as he describes:

During the Discover Manufacturing class I had many opportunities: networking, learning about academic programs and the manufacturing industry, touring facilities, and hands-on activities using specific tools. I networked with PCC staff and faculty, my



classmates, and industry professionals. For example, I met a hiring manager when we toured a medical device manufacturing facility and an industry professional from Boeing who shared his career development trajectory with our class.

"During each of our class sessions, I watched Abdijelil engage and ask questions, whether it was a visit from a PCC representative or industry professional, on a tour of the Machine Manufacturing or Welding shop facilities, during a Bioscience Technology activity, or a show-and-tell with Microelectronics. He showed genuine interest and was clearly gathering information so that he could make an informed decision about his future," said his instructor Ariel Ladum. Through these experiences, Ilmi said, "I learned about the range of opportunities available at PCC regarding academic programs as well as resources that can help me be successful, and made personal connections with representatives from those units."

Making these connections during activities, class tours of PCC campus facilities, and manufacturing environments helped Ilmi identify how he could apply his existing experience and education to jumpstart and build his career. He completed the Discover class August 25, 2023, decided to onboard to the Business Construction Technology program at PCC for fall term, and was awarded a generous grant from Lease Crutcher Lewis with the fast-track educational goal of earning a Certificate in Building Construction Technology. Ilmi is currently taking program courses in addition to ESOL courses at PCC, continues to work with Opportunity Center staff to identify and access additional resources, and is excited for the next steps in his journey!

Foundations of Interpersonal Neurobiology (IPNB) Certificate

IPNB combines neuroscience, psychology, complexity theory, environmental influences, and relationship studies. Developed by Dr. Dan Siegel, Dr. Allan Schore and Dr. Lou Cozolino in the late 1990s, Interpersonal Neurobiology seeks similar neurological patterns that exist in separate science fields.

Students in this program will discover what neuroscience and relating reveal about how we learn, resolve trauma and conflict, and improve relationships. IPNB illuminates how the mind and brain develop across the lifespan. It has profound applications for professionals working in healthcare, education, leadership, parenting, organizational development, and more.

Through successful completion of the Foundations of Interpersonal Neurobiology certificate program, learners will be able to:

- Articulate and apply the core tenets and constructs of Interpersonal Neurobiology
- 2. Identify, analyze and discuss ethical issues using an IPNB framework
- Describe the mechanisms and connections among cortical and subcortical structures as they relate to stress, perception, memory, attention, empathy, regulation, and integration
- Develop personal, professional, and spiritual practices that enhance awareness, and promote health, and wellbeing
- Apply concepts of IPNB in our nascent awareness of the effects of disrupted connection, including relational rupture, exclusion and marginalization, bias, dehumanization, toxic stress, and trauma
- Apply and extend foundational principles of IPNB through reflective practices of inclusion, leadership, and community-building

- Recognize and integrate consilient science of mind, embodied brain, and relationships in an emergent awareness of our human potential
- Integrate and apply a holistic view of human systems as the embodied and relational flow of energy and information within and between elements, including neural and human networks.

The Portland Community College Ayurvedic Yoga Health Program consists of four modules (courses).

Program Length: One Year (4 module) Program

Each module teaches you how to tap into the healing potential of its respective season. Continue throughout the year and see how the seasons bring health naturally.

Winter: Ayurveda, Yoga and Tridosha

Discover how to balance the mind, body, and spirit through both Yoga and Ayurveda. Learn assessment skills and recommendations for perfect health. Includes cooking, restorative



yoga, aromatherapy, Marma, breathing practices and basic herbs, and Mudras.

Spring: Ayurveda, Yoga, and Panchakarma

Emphasis on health management systems and proper balance with food, spices, nutrition, lifestyle and daily routines. Covers Nasya (nasal oil drops), Neti (nasal cleansing), massage oils, powders, and preparatory process for Panchakarma therapy. Learn the basics of detoxifying in the Spring and discover the year-long health benefits. Learn how to prepare kitchari and basic teas.

Summer: Ayurveda, Yoga, and Self Care

Find health, beauty, wellness, and bliss from the inside out. Learn yoga and breathing recommendation for perfect health. The class covers both theory and practical applications from Mudra, Marma and Bhandha to Asana, Yantra, and Mantra. Discover Ayurvedic foods, spices, recipes and cooking tips for each constitution (Dosha) for perfect balance.

Fall: Ayurveda, Yoga and Philosophy

Learn about Ayurvedic anatomy and systems: the five elements (Panchamahabhutas), three bio-energies (Doshas), anatomy and body tissues (Dhatus), and universal qualities (Gunas). Discover how the sister sciences of Yoga and Ayurveda overlap.
