# **Course Description, Objectives & Outcomes**

Welcome! We hold these truths to be self-evident.... Democracy depends on a free press for independent & accurate news media. This innovative course explores diverse examples that pull back the curtain on how key parts of U.S. & global news and info media function. Is your concern free speech, new ideas & technology? Or, corporate conglomeration, misinformation & polarization? And whether you're in-person or online, do you know how to assess news media credibility? By expanding our knowledge with new resources & methods, students will apply course learning objectives and develop practical, transferable skillsets.

Is your news from old school TV, radio & newspapers? Or from Vox.com, TikTok, YouTube, and X / Twitter? Regardless, media disinformation and alleged 'fake news' make too many people wonder if the truth is even out there. In our new screen-media society -- especially in times of crisis -- everyone, from beginner to returning professional, needs to know how to tell fact from fiction, from propaganda. We'll learn empirical methods to verify the headlines, news stories, & social media -- and to decode what's real. And, to do this deep dive, we'll first revisit the roots of modern media....

## Learning Outcomes

- Apply methods from social sciences & media literacy to assess news credibility
- Grow personally & professionally by practicing transferable skills such as institutional analysis
- Contribute to their communities as engaged consumers & citizens.

#### **Activities, Methods, & Resources**

Each week, students & instructor use video, online, and text-based media to analyze & assess the news. Using multimedia, interactive presentations and discussions -- including small groups -- we'll bring news stories & outlets into the classroom. You can select your own news article and apply a rigorous assessment method (see attached Form) developed through <a href="Instructor Butz">Instructor Butz</a>' <a href="PhD research">PhD research</a>.
