Course Description and Objectives

Welcome to ESOL Level 2! In this course, you will practice your English skills in all areas: reading, writing, speaking, and listening. In ESOL 20, Level 2 Integrated Skills, you will:

1. read and understand;
2. write with correct grammar;
3. participate in class activities;
4. complete homework assignments;
5. speak with other students and the teacher;
6. use technology to develop your English language skills.




Course Grades

You will receive one of the following non-credit grades at the end of term:

- **CM** completed the class; move to the next level
- **PR** will continue in the class for another term (repeat the course)
- **L** left the class before the end
- **UP** have not shown progress; cannot continue in ESOL

The ESOL department has 8 levels of English. Students usually study in ESOL 20 for 3 terms. The instructor decides each student's level for the next term. The instructor uses test scores and the student's progress in learning English during the term. Only students whose English is progressing well may register for the next term.
