Class Description:

Overcome your fears about making art in a safe and friendly environment. This 8-week introductory class will cover basic art-making methods and materials in an approachable and fun manner. You will experiment and play with drawing, color mixing, painting, collage, photography, and sculpture. Each week we will focus on new things, and you will have time to work in class. You will be encouraged to continue your explorations outside of class. No prior experience necessary.

Learning Goals:

Students will acquire some basic abilities in drawing, color, using paint, simple sculpture, basic photography, and composition. Students will engage in both 2 and 3-dimensional art-making using various materials and simple methods. Students will increase their understanding of art-making as a process. Each student will be encouraged to develop and pursue their individual vision and creative expression through class assignments and both group and individual dialogue.

Elements of Course:

- 1. Weekly image viewing of art examples for ideas and inspiration
- 2. Suggestions for out-of-class projects and artistic exploration
- 3. Weekly demonstrations of simple techniques: materials and methods
- 4. Group and individual dialogue
- 5. Establishment of supportive creative community

Course Outline:

Week 1: Drawing: contour, gesture, perspective, expression, negative space

Week 2: Composition/Collage: pieces of things re-assembled (2 D/paper)

Week 3: Color: mixing, combinations, basic color theory

Week 4: Painting: mixing colors, composition, technique

Week 5: Sculpture 1: wire, etc

- Week 6: Sculpture 2: paper and cardboard
- Week 7: Photography: cell phones, and using apps for effects
- Week 8: Multi-media/Found Object Art: combinations, tension, surprise, alter, transform, recontextualize
