Notes:

- Visual Elements to consider line, shape, value, texture, and color
- Try to focus on the visual elements and avoid giving a label if you can – suspend what you know about the subject, just for a bit.
- Composition – the placement of elements in relation to one another AND in relation to the picture plane.
- The first shape in any composition is the paper format itself.
- Principles of Design – Balance, Unity and Variety, Emphasis, Rhythm, Scale and Proportion, Contrast
- Thumbnail sketches – small, quick sketches done before a drawing to work through possible compositions.
- Avoid blending with fingers – oil doesn't mix well with the charcoal
- Sighting – once you have loosely sketched the gesture, use a straight edge to measure and adjust your drawing.
- Step back from your work every once in a while, this helps us see it in its entirety
- Use a blending rag, blending stub, or kneaded eraser to move the charcoal
- Follow the form – if your marks wrap around the form, it will add more volume to your drawing.
- Light – think about a single, decisive light source so that your shadows are simplified.
