- 4. Come to class on time, participate, do the homework, and tell the teacher if you need to be absent.
- 5. Use the computer lab and the internet to practice English.

#### Course Grades

The instructor uses test scores and the student's progress in learning English during the term. Only students whose English is progressing well may register for the next term.
