| I | like | concerts. |
| You | have | a grill. |
| We | go | to the movies. |
| They | buy | popcorn at the movies. |
| Americans | enjoy | museums |
| Subject | Verb (-s form) | Complement |
| He | likes | popcorn. |
| She | has | a lot of friends. |
| Simon | enjoys | the Super Bowl. |
| My family | spends | a lot of time in the park. |
| Our team | plays | every Saturday. |

## Spelling of the -s Form

| Examples | Explanation |
| :--- | :--- |
| visit - visits <br> like - likes | Add $-s$ to most verbs to make the $-s$ form. |
| kiss - kisses <br> wash - washes <br> watch - watches <br> fix - fixes | Add -es to base forms with $s s, s h, c h$, or $x$ at the end. |
| worry - worries <br> try - tries | If the base form ends in a consonant $+y$, change $y$ to -i and add -es. |
| pay - pays <br> enjoy - enjoys | If the base form ends in a vowel $+y$, do not change the $\boldsymbol{y}$. Just add $-s$. |

| Examples | Explanations |
| :--- | :--- |
| American movie theaters sell popcorn. | Use the simple present tense for facts. |
| We go to the movies once a week. | Use the simple present tense for repeated <br> actions, such as customs, routines, and habits. |
| Americans like the movies. | Use the simple present tense with like, want, and <br> need. |
