



Associates of Applied Science in Addiction Counseling at Portland Community College articulated with the Bachelor of Applied Science Degree in Human Services at Clark College

This articulation agreement is between Portland Community College (PCC) and Clark College. The purpose of this agreement is to develop, maintain, and promote a smooth academic pathway that supports successful student transition from PCC's Associate of Applied Science (AAS) – Addiction Counselor to the completion of the Clark College Bachelor of Applied Science degree in Human Services (BASHS). PCC graduates who have earned the Addiction Counselor AAS since Fall 2019 are covered by this agreement.

Clark College agrees to accept credits for students who have completed the Addiction Counselor AAS as outlined in the attached Sample Plan of Study. These documents are hereby incorporated and made a part of this Agreement. This Agreement does not apply to students transferring with a different associate degree from PCC, or choosing a different major or program at Clark College; such students may be evaluated for admission to Clark College on a case-by-case basis.

Changes made to relevant curriculum at either PCC or Clark College will necessitate review of the programs at both institutions to determine if modification of Agreement is necessary. If deemed appropriate, a new agreement will be generated and signed. Curriculum changes by either PCC or Clark College must be communicated in writing no later than June 30 of any academic year by the individuals identified in Contract Maintenance.

Each partner assumes responsibility for informing their students of curricular revisions that would impact student planning and/or degree completion. In the event graduation requirements for the bachelor's degree at Clark College change within this time, the standards and practices established by Clark College to cover such a change will apply to transferring students.

This agreement shall commence October 1, 2019 or on the date of the last signature entered in the Contract Administration section, whichever is later, and shall terminate October 1, 2024, unless terminated earlier as provided elsewhere in this agreement. Either party may terminate or suspend this Agreement for convenience upon sixty (60) days written notice; provided, however, that the parties shall discuss and reasonably attempt to resolve the issues that led to the notice of termination or suspension during the sixty (60) day period. Notwithstanding the termination of the Agreement, any student who has applied for transfer from PCC to Clark College prior to or during the sixty (60) day period shall be treated as if this Agreement continues to be in effect.

Admission to Clark does not guarantee admission to specific Clark degree programs which may have additional requirement such as GPA, test score or other criteria. This agreement does not convey any promises, such as financial aid or course placement, unless otherwise noted. Students wishing to enroll at Clark must meet the following admission requirements:

- Meeting all Clark admission criteria (either freshmen or transfer student) prior to enrollment in the student's first Clark course.
- Passing with a grade of C- or higher all required community college courses as identified in this agreement.

BAS Degree Requirements

In addition to completing an AAS-Addiction Counselor degree, students must also complete all of the major and distribution area requirements:

- Complete a minimum of one hundred and eighty (180) college-level credits
- Complete sixty (60) upper division (300 or 400 level) credits
- Complete the following BAS general education requirements: Communication Skills (10 credits), Quantitative/Symbolic Reasoning Skills (5 credits), Humanities (10 credits), Social Science (10 credits), Natural Sciences (10 credits, including one laboratory course)
- Maintain a minimum cumulative college-level grade point average (GPA) of 2.00 or higher
- Thirty (30) credits minimum must be completed at Clark College to meet Academic Residency

Non-discrimination. The parties agree that there shall be no unlawful discrimination based on race, color, national origin, religion, handicap, age, or sex, or any other legally protected classification in any of their policies, practices, or procedures.

In carrying out the responsibilities and obligations of this Agreement, neither party shall be acting as the agent or principal of the other with regard to dealings with third parties, including students. Neither party shall have the authority to make any statements, representations, nor commitments of any kind or to take any action binding the other except as provided for herein or authorized in writing by the party to be bound.

This Agreement constitutes the entire Agreement between the parties. No waiver, consent, modification, or change of terms of this Agreement shall bind either party unless in writing and signed by both parties.
