
**Effective Fall Term 2010**

It is agreed that students transferring from Portland Community College (PCC) in an Associate of Applied Science program (other than Accounting, Marketing, Management and Retail Management) to Southern Oregon University's (SOU) Bachelor of Applied Science in Management program will be given full credit for all selected courses listed below. This agreement is based on the evaluation of the rigor and content of the general education and technical courses at both PCC and SOU, and will remain in effect until it is updated or terminated by PCC or SOU. This agreement is dated July 27, 2010.


Baccalaureate students must complete a minimum of 60 credits of upper-division work before a degree will be awarded. Upper-division is defined as 300-and 400-level classes at a bachelor's degree granting institution. Baccalaureate students at SOU must complete 45 credits from SOU before a degree will be awarded. To become admitted to the BAS program, students must hold an AAS degree outside the area of business or accounting with a GPA of 2.5 or better. Admission to SOU is not guaranteed. SOU program requirements specified in this agreement shall apply when the student is admitted to SOU. Students must enroll at SOU within three years of completing their AAS program at PCC.


Transfer students may guarantee their catalog of graduation by obtaining written approval from their SOU major department. The agreed upon catalog will be the one a student uses when he/she transfers to SOU as long as the student enrolls at SOU within three years of completing their AAS program at PCC. If a student enrolls later, the catalog of graduation will be that which is in effect at the time of SOU enrollment.

Curricular changes are communicated via the OrACRAO website. SOU and PCC shall review curricular changes annually. If curricular changes impact this agreement, it will be revised accordingly by either SOU or PCC. Each partner assumes responsibility for informing their students of such revisions. SOU program requirements specified in this agreement shall apply when the student is admitted to SOU.

## **About the Program**

This course of study in a career technical field and management has been developed with the cooperation and support of Southern Oregon University (SOU). This program is fully articulated with SOU's Bachelor of Applied Science in Management program and allows students to transfer and become admitted into the School of Business at Southern Oregon University to pursue a bachelor's degree. The program offers an excellent balance of career technical coursework, business coursework, and general education courses that support advanced study in Management.

Students should contact a counselor at PCC or the SOU School of Business early in the first year of their AAS program to be advised about additional requirements and procedures for admission to the school or program. Students should be aware of the admission requirements at SOU, including the minimum GPA requirement of 2.50 in their AAS program.

Students should be aware that if they transfer before completing their AAS degree, they will not be eligible for the BAS program and their courses will be evaluated toward the School of Business requirements in effect at SOU.

## **Entry Requirements at PCC**

Students are required to take the college placement test to determine skill level and readiness indicated by test scores. As part of their training program, students must begin with the courses within their skill levels as determined by placement test scores. In addition, students may also be required to enroll in classes that would increase their employability and success.

## **SOU Admission Requirement**

Admission to SOU is not guaranteed. Students must apply for admission to SOU in accordance with the then-existing rules, policies and procedures of SOU. Students who have graduated from high school or completed a high school equivalency program in 1997 or after must have the following requirement for admission to a four-year Oregon state college or university: 1) Two years of the same high school-level foreign language, or 2) two terms of college-level foreign language with a grade of "C-" or better (may be first-year language which can be used as elective credits). A grade of Pass (P) will suffice where the transcript indicates that P is equivalent to a C- or better.

## **Advanced Standing**

Coursework from accredited colleges and universities will be accepted in accordance with college policies and the approval of the Dean of the School of Business. To ensure coursework is current, program course credits over 10 years old may be reviewed and approved by the appropriate department head before being accepted toward course requirements.

## **SOU Graduation Requirements**

Students must complete a minimum of 180 quarter credits to earn a bachelor's degree at SOU. Students must earn C- or better in Written & Oral Communication General Education courses (a Pass grade is not acceptable). For additional degree requirements, visit the SOU School of Business website listed below, and consult with an academic advisor.

To be eligible for the BAS program, students must complete an Associate of Applied Science program *in any field except Business or Accounting* with a GPA of 2.5 or better. Not all AAS degree programs require the same amount of transferable general education coursework. If a student intends to transfer to SOU's Bachelor of Applied Science program, SOU's general education courses should be chosen where possible in the AAS degree. Approximately 56-64 credits of Career Technical coursework will transfer into the BAS program depending on how much general education is completed as part of the AAS program. 1. SOU accepts a maximum of 124 credits from a community college. The number of career technical credits applicable to this program depends upon the number of credits a student transfers to satisfy general education requirements. SOU's BAS in Management degree requires 180 total credits.
2. SOU requires three social science classes from an approved list. Econ201 and Econ202 are required for the BAS program. Students may find the list of approved courses on the General Education Transfer Guide at [www.sou.edu/admissions/transfer](http://www.sou.edu/admissions/transfer) and select "General Education Transfer Guides."
3. SOU requires three humanities classes from an approved list of courses. Students may find the list of approved courses on the General Education Transfer Guide at [www.sou.edu/admissions/transfer](http://www.sou.edu/admissions/transfer) and select "General Education Transfer Guides."
4. SOU requires three sciences classes from an approved list. Two of those courses must have a lab. 5. Baccalaureate students must complete a minimum of 60 credits of upper-division work before a degree will be awarded. Upper-division is defined as 300- and 400- level classes at a bachelor's degree granting institution.
