- Communication Studies Focus Award REVISION
 - COMM 112 moved into Required Courses
 - About 37 Focus Awards awarded in 5 years
 - Approved by committee
- Earth Science Focus Award New
 - New Focus Award with 3 separate "tracks" students may choose from
 - Revised sentence under the heading "Earth Studies Focus Award Requirements" to read "To receive the Earth Studies Focus Award, a student must complete 17 credits by completing one of the three tracks."
 - Approved with amendments by committee
- Health Studies Focus Award REVISION
 - o Added and revised some language to clarify requirements for students
 - o HE 262 added to Elective Health Courses
 - Removed SOC 231 and added CG 130 and SOC 206 to Approved Related Courses
 - o About 20 to 25 Focus Awards awarded per year
 - HUS 102 and HUS 106 are CTE courses, which are not permitted to be included in a focus award, only LDC courses are permitted – the courses were removed from the focus award

A102 was recommended at last month's meeting and has been moved forward

G301 - Grading Guidelines

- APS had updated G301 to include the college's use of grade marks to align policy with practice, as grade marks for non-credit ABE and ESOL courses were not previously in official PCC grading policy - Curriculum Committee recommended G301
- In the future, expect to see more substantial revisions to the "Grade Definitions" and "Attendance" sections
- Recommended by committee

Reports -

General Education Revision Report: Erik Puris/Stacey Williams

- The Gen Ed outcomes were endorsed by the EAC
- DSACs have developed the scoring rubrics and the signature assignments, about 800 of them; transparent assignment design is an important equity driver
- GEARS is now concerned with the overall process of getting all SACs through the committee with their artifacts/signatures assignments, CCOG updates and response to the Gen Ed philosophy statement
- GEARS Review Schedule and the lottery selection of SACs now completed; courses will start being reviewed in January and must be in the workflow by November 2019
- Very important to match SACs with their assigned mentors to assist in the gen ed review process
- February 2021 is the deadline for the GEARS process SACs must make a decision about which courses they want to have a gen ed designation, as the gen ed list will be revised only ONCE later that year

Guided Pathways Report: Eriks Puris

- From May 9 10, the Oregon Pathways Project and OTAC (Oregon Transfer Articulation Committee) meet at Chemeketa Community College; the next meeting will take place November 14 – 15 at Lane Community College
- This December PCC will chose the final guided pathways and implement them next year

State Report: Kendra Cawley

OTAC suggested creating two new state-wide transfer degrees – Associate of Arts
Transfer (AAT) and Associate of Science Transfer (AST) – to house the Major
Transfer Maps (MTMs) within the degrees themselves; this is something the DAC
needs to start thinking about, as the creation of these new state transfer degrees is
likely on the horizon in the years to come
