## **Chair Report from EAC**

Discussion:

All new degrees and certificates from October meeting were approved for recommendation to Dr. Pulliams by the EAC. Dr. Pulliams approved them.

Since our last meeting, Linda Gerber, SY President, called a group together to discuss the Sustainability Focus Award. Kendra and Susanne were present along with Focus Award co-chairs. Given the current guidelines and constraints in our system, it was agreed to create two paths: focus award with LDC courses and CTE Program Award which primarily CTE courses.

Janeen Hull and Phil Christain will represent the committee as Completion Investment Council members.

Phil represented the committee at a DQP: Degree Qualifying Profile meeting in Eugene. Lumina Foundation for Higher Education is using DQP to analyze and assess all degrees from Associates to Masters and whether they are worth acquiring. They have come up with benchmarks for assessment. It is a University of Oregon grant. Lane is the principle investigator on the grant. PCC has committed to participate in the first year of the grant.

Proposed grade requirement: All courses must be passed with a letter grade of "C" or better.

#### **New Business:**

**2:30 Revision: Alcohol and Drug Counseling: Addiction Studies Certificate: Jon Gieber:** Delete one course; reduce a course credit, adding two courses, revised outcomes, submitting a career pathway template, making certificate into a career pathway.

Discussion:

Some students are able to get jobs with just one course but moving up requires more education. This certificate aims to give the student the skills they require at a lower cost.

The committee asked about the outcomes not being different from the AAS. Jon Gieber stated that the AAS has more practicum and more elective choices for the student's broadening education. Discussion occurred on how to best distinguish differences between certificate and AAS for the student. It was agreed to revise the AAS degree outcome by splitting its current first outcome into two outcomes and changing the practicum hours to 648.

Eriks moved, Janeen seconded. Unanimous recommendation for approval with the understanding that the AAS Degree outcomes are revised as written in the committee. Curriculum Office will do the paperwork on this additional revision. **APPROVED and AMENDED NON AGENDA ITEM.**
