February 20, 2014 Board Meeting Budget Update





 Mid Year FY 13-14 projection: We expect to balance our budget without dipping into our fund balance

- Preliminary view of FY 14-15 also on target to balance
 - Assumes a 7% reduction of enrollment





- Supplemental Budget Resolution 14-099
- A common budget event for Oregon Com. Colleges
 - PCC usually does supplemental twice a year
- The Final Audited beginning fund balances are different from our estimates during budget process
- PCC adopted the 2013-15 biennium budget before the Legislature finalized the CCSF budget amount
 - From \$428M to \$450M, and to the current \$465M
- Our contract agreements with both federations were not finalized until July 2013, after the budget adoption





Tuition Resolution 14-103 for FY 2014-15





- Tuition Resolution 14-103 for FY 2014-15
- Board approved in Feb 2013 the 2nd year (14-15) a \$5 per credit increase to \$93
- State approved an additional \$15 million for CCSF for the 2nd year of the biennium in September 2013 with a budget note for tuition relief
- Board desired to revisit the FY 14-15 rate if additional resources





- Tuition Resolution 14-103 for FY 2014-15- continued
- Staff Recommendations in 14-103:
 - Reduce the \$5 tuition increase to \$4, a reduction of \$1 to \$92 per credit hour effective Summer Term, 2014.
 - Remainder of additional CCSF revenue in 2nd year to help affordability/access and completion:





- Tuition Resolution 14-103 for FY 2014-15- continued
- PCC's share of the additional \$15 million CCSF for 2014-15 is \$3.8 million
- The amount is equivalent to approximately \$4 per credit of tuition increase
- If all go to tuition rate reduction, the impact for students who enroll half time (6 credit hours) or full time (12 credit hours):
 - Half time: \$24 per term or \$72 a year (3 terms)
 - Full time: \$48 per term or \$144 a year (3 terms)





Current Biennium 2013-15: FY 2014-15 Tuition Resolution 14-103- continued

- \$1 per credit reduction = approx. \$900K
- \$2.9 million (\$3.8M 900K) will remain for the two initiatives in the Resolution
- From 2012-13 data:

An average of 15,850 students per term would be eligible under the tuition initiative, approximately 50% of the credit students per term





- Tuition Resolution 14-103 for FY 2014-15- continued
 - Average amount for each eligible full-time student would be \$219
- PCC tuition rate ranking would move up to # 7 from our current tie for 10 (assuming no increases for other colleges <worst case>)
- The estimated relief per student won't affect FA award
- Implementation of the tuition initiative will be Winter 2015, based on Fall 2014 data
