How do students get F-1 Visa?

- Apply to PCC as International Student \$50 application fee)
- Demonstrate financial resources (\$18,000)
 - Liquid funds in bank statements/letters, within 6 mos of anticipated date of attendance
- PCC issues I-20
- Student applies for Visa
- Approximately 50-60% of admitted students enroll

Services Provided by International Education

- Admissions and I-20s (VISA support)
- Orientation
- English Language support
- DHS compliance via SEVIS (Student and Exchange Visitor Information System)
- Advising
- Student Activities

Orientation

- Typically 130-150 students each term
- 5 days
- Advising, intro to the college, the campus, campus life, expectations etc.
- 1 day placement testing
- Staff: "all hands on deck" + 12 international student orientation leaders

SEVIS

(Student and Exchange Visitor Information System)

- PCC is required by the Department of Homeland Security to monitor attendance and progress and update SEVIS every student, every term to verify that they are:
 - still attending
 - taking the appropriate number of credits
 - making appropriate progress
- If not, must file change of status

- International students do not generate state funding, even if we are below the state funding cap.
- International students do not increase property tax revenues.
- The only additional revenue international students generate is tuition and fees.

- International students generate over \$5 million in revenue.
- When all direct and indirect costs are considered, PCC is losing over \$150,000 per year.

- An increase of \$10 per credit hour or a \$121 fee per term would cover the deficit and provide approximately \$100,000 for reinvestment and enhancement of the program.
- As it now stands there is no increase in international education tuition or fees, pending Board action.

- From 2010-11 through 2014-15 resident tuition has increased 21%.
- From 2010-11 through 2014-15 international tuition has increased 7.8%.
- Ratio of international tuition to resident tuition has decreased from 2.7 to 2.4 over this time period.



English Language Programming

- Most students place into ESOL levels 4-8, \$185/cr
 - All levels for credit; in class with resident students
- Students who place into ESOL levels 1-3
 - Intensive English Program (non-credit), \$2400 /term
 - additional hours of instruction to meet the requirements of F1 visa
 - Increase in number of students with IEP placement, currently 60-70 per term (2-3 sections, mixed level)
 - Students can take IEP 3X
- A few students place out of ESOL
 - generally only 5-10 per orientation cohort.

Advising and Activities

- Advising (4.75 Advisors, 3 Office Assistants)
 - SEVIS verification
 - Advising
- Activities: 1 Activities Coordinator
 - Talk Time Café, Conversation Partners
 - Group Community Activities
 - Student Ambassadors (ASPCC, Multicultural Center etc)
