New Vision

The Skill Center is a resource for students who need support and assistance in enhancing pre-entry characteristics so that they will be more likely to enter college or the workforce successfully. The Skill Center supports existing college services and programs, both instructional and Student Affairs, by providing students with information and training that will prepare them to be effective college students.



Instructional and Student Support

Re-Entry Programs

- Planned collaboration with Coffee Creek and Columbia River Correctional facility to address high recidivism rates in Oregon.
- •Goal to connect inmates in correctional educational programs with community college and career opportunities after release, providing needed workforce experience and education.
- Recently awarded a Juvenile Justice Re-entry Grant by the Dept. of Justice.
- In the largest study of US correctional programs RAND found for \$1 invested in prison education \$5 saved in policing and incarceration costs.

Middle College Pathway to College

- **Jefferson High School:** The first four-year cohort to complete the full **Middle College** program posted an 80 percent graduation rate, a **25% gain** since 2010-11.
- •90% of the Class of 2015's 104 seniors earned at least 4 college credits during high school. 66% completed 12 or more.
- Class of 2016 has 106 seniors and 81 or
 75% are on track for the Middle College
 Diploma up from 66% in 2015
- Margaret Calvert named 2016 Principal of the Year by COSA
