



# PCC Budget Snapshot

### 2017-19 BUDGET PLANNING CONSIDERATIONS

- The State of Oregon has a projected budget deficit of \$1.8 billion.
- Enrollment is down at PCC—as is the trend at other community colleges nationwide.
- In 2013–15, PCC began budget tightening measures, eliminating \$8 million in expenses.
- PCC currently has a projected deficit of nearly \$12 million.

### WHAT IS BEING DONE?

- Vacant staff positions are under review.
- Strategic planning proposals for new programs and initiatives are currently on hold.
- Budget scenarios are being prepared for the PCC Board of Directors. These scenarios include reductions in expenditures and tuition increases,
