

- Implement Men of Color Program
- Develop bridge program for incoming students who place in developmental education classes
- Carry out Campus Inclusion Change Team (ICT) plan to create a more equitable and inclusive campus climate



Campus Goal: Make data-informed decisions regarding academic programs and student success initiatives

- Adjust budgets to support strategic and expanding programs including apprenticeships, coding, MM/MSA, Medical Assisting
- Close achievement/outcomes gaps through investment in culturally relevant support programs and professional development
