## Prepared for PCC's Board of Directors Review: Proposed Assumptions for 2013-14 Achievement Compact Targets

The 2013-14 Achievement Compact will consist of 88 **projections** of completion of the current year and 88 **targets** proposed for 2013-14.

Column one in the following table is a summary of various assumptions used for establishing targets in last year's compact. The second column provides a suggested update to those assumptions based on an analysis of the current environment.
