

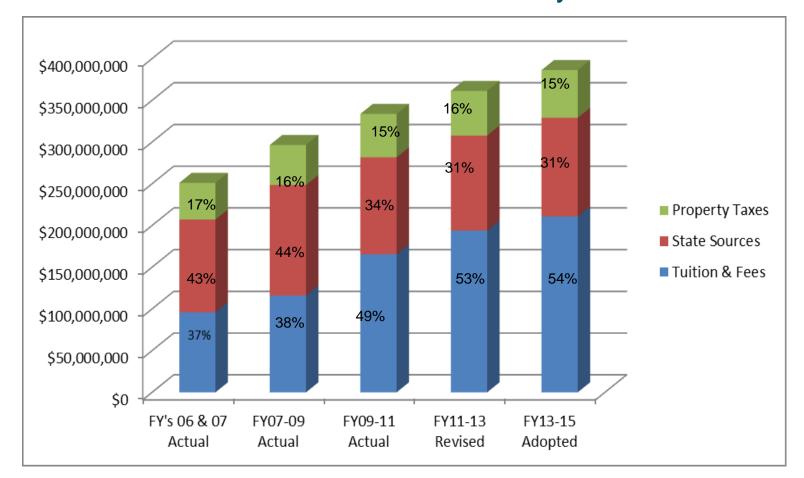

PCC revenue structure and its 5-year trend







Tuition in 13-14: \$88 per credit hour; Board approved \$5 inc. for 14-15 Common student support fees approved by the Board:

Technology fee	\$4.50 per credit	Supports student and instructional technology.
Student activity fee	\$1.70 per credit	Supports student activities including student government.
College service fee	\$15 per term	Supports services including transcripts and book lockers.
Transportation fee	\$4 per term	Supports transportation services.





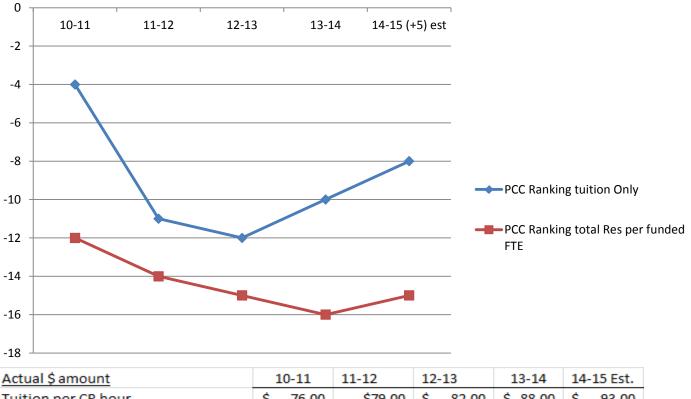
- Oregon Community Colleges all charge fees like PCC

History ranking trend of our tuition and total resources per FTE

Why the trend for total resources per FTE for PCC:

- 1. We are equally funded since 2011-12 for all FTE <u>except</u> that the CCSF allocation formula <u>has two built-in components</u> that disadvantage PCC for resources per FTE due to its size:
 - a. <u>Small School Adjustment</u>: The first 1,100 SFTE is funded at an additional \$720 per FTE. For colleges that are under 1,100 FTE, they get at least an additional \$720 per funded FTE, while PCC gets about \$29 per funded FTE. (Diff ~700)
 - **b.** <u>Funded enrollment cap</u>: PCC has approx. 5,000 SFTE in 2013-14 that are not funded by the State allocation, only tuition. (We lost by a 16-1 vote on this).
 - a. 10 Colleges are over the cap
 - b. Of the total SFTEs over the cap, PCC accounts for 68% of it





Events recap and developments in 2013:

- 1. Board approved in Feb 2013 the 2nd year (14-15) a \$5 per credit increase to \$92.
- 2. State approved an additional \$15 million for CCSF for the 2nd year of the biennium in September 2013 with a budget note for tuition relief
- 3. PCC's share is about \$3.8 million.
 - a. Due to the contract settlement contingency: .5% increase in compensation to the federations for 2014-15, \$850 to 900K.
- The net allows us to reduce the tuition increase up to \$3 per credit
 (i.e. from the approved \$5 to \$2)





Events recap and developments in 2013, continued:

4. For 2015-17 biennium, CCSF needs to be at \$480 million in order to stay at par with 2013-15.

5. Uncertainties:

- a. The PERS reforms legislations subject to court challenges (SB 822 and SB 861)- could make savings become 1-time
- b. PERS will be increasing their rates for 15-17 regardless of whether these SBs are upheld or not
- c. Enrollment is dropping: tuition revenue will likely come under our projections. (Fall down 3.8% and Winter so far 7.0%)





Events recap and developments in 2013, continued:

- 5. Uncertainties (continued):
 - c. Our budget balancing plan for the 2013-15 biennium is still being implemented—some of the will not take effect until 2014-15.
 - d. Good news is that %-wise we spent less than 2012-13 at the same time.
- 6. We are doing a mid-year 2013-14 projection. Depending on Spring 2014 enrollment, we would balance our revenue and expenditures or have a slight dipping into the fund balance.





What Other Oregon CC preliminary plans for tuition for FY 2014-15 after the \$15 million addition:

1. No tuition increase:

 Klamath, Clatsop, Blue Mountain, Umpqua, Rogue & Columbia Gorge.

2. Still in discussion:

- a. Oregon Coast, Mount Hood, Clackamas, Chemeketa, Linn-Benton, Southwestern & Tillamook.
- 3. Some tuition increase (some tie to COLA):
 - a. Lane \$ 2 or higher; Treasure Valley \$1 or \$2, Central Oregon \$1





Staff Recommendation assuming our new CCSF base going forward is \$480 million in the 2015-17 biennium:

- 1. Reduce the \$5 tuition increase to \$3, a reduction of \$2.
- 2. Use a small portion of 2nd year tuition increase to help access and completion:
 - a. Earmark up to \$1 of tuition to College need based financial aid, or
 - b. Dedicate a portion to students to high stakes Math courses who complete and enroll in the next higher level, particularly the pre-college to college math transition (through tuition reimbursement or scholarship), or
 - c. For students who have successfully completed 100% of attempted credits, provide scholarships for subsequent term





Other Considerations:

- 1. Monitor the Feb 2014 legislative session
- Track the PERs lawsuit
- 3. Follow up on the uncertainties
- 4. Make any necessary mid-biennium adjustments to our 2013-15 budget; to prepare us for 2015-17





Financial Aid Timelines

- Financial Aid requires us to make tuition decisions at the February Board Meeting so that we could assure financial aid ready for 2014-15 Academic Year.
- A resolution to the Board to effect the final changes to the approved \$5 per credit tuition increases in the February 20, 2014 meeting.
